The National Consortium for Teaching about Asia (NCTA) is pleased to announce an NCTA Seminar on East Asia for teachers on Colorado's Western Slope. Approximately half of this 30-hour seminar will be offered online, the other half face-to-face. The winter 2010 seminar offers secondary teachers the opportunity to engage in study, analysis, and discussion of new scholarship related to Chinese and Japanese history, geography, and culture. The seminar is open to secondary world geography, world history, and world literature teachers who are teaching courses that include the study of China and/or Japan during the 2009-10 school year.

Seminar Location, Delivery, and Dates:

- 15 hours of face-to-face instruction in the Grand Junction area (exact location to be determined) on January 9, 30, and February 20.
- 15 hours of online instruction and discussion through Moodle course management system during January, February, and March.
- 3 hours of face-to-face follow-up on April 24.

Benefits and Details of Participation: Teachers pay \$50 registration fee and receive the following:

- 30 contact hours of study, curriculum, and discussion with East Asian specialists and fellow educators.
- Seminar textbooks and materials.
- \$250 cash stipend upon satisfactory completion of the seminar and seminar project.
- \$225 in selected curriculum materials for your school upon successful completion of program.
- Optional: 2 graduate credits through University of Colorado for \$100 (pending approval).

Expectations: Seminar participants agree to

- Participate in the full 30 hours of the seminar, in both face-to-face and online formats.
- Complete all seminar assignments and final project.
