Browse by Agency List on GPO Access available at <http://www.gpoaccess.gov/cfr/>

Look for cross-references from other sources like *United States Code Service* or *CCH Bankruptcy Law Reporter*.

Be aware of industry lingo, like "Part 135 operation" in air transport refers to FAA regulations at 14 C.F.R. Part 135. Similarly, "Part 68" in telecommunications refers to the FCC's rules for connecting equipment to the public switched telephone network, from 47 C.F.R. Part 68.

Suggested resources for keeping up with regulatory changes

Most up-to-date CFR text: the eCFR at GPO Access (<http://www.gpoaccess.gov>)

Know the future: changes will pre-announced in the Unified Agenda, also available from GPO

Participate in rulemakings: use Regulations.gov to search for rules open for comment and to submit your comments directly.

Get more email: sign up to have the Federal Register's table of contents sent to you every day. (Or set up a more focused alert on Lexis or Westlaw.)
