

Last Minute Information Colorado Fulbright Gateway Orientation – August 1-5, 2011

Here is some information about arrival and settling in at the Colorado Fulbright Gateway Orientation.

Arrival:

- **Transportation options from airport:** You can find information about how to get to Boulder from the airport on our web site here: <http://www.colorado.edu/oie/FulbGateway/arrival.html>. Unfortunately, no one is able to meet you at the airport, but there are information desks there with people who can help you. If you follow the instruction on the web site, getting to Boulder should be very easy.
- **Housing:** You will be staying in Kittredge West Hall, a residence hall on the University of Colorado Boulder campus.
- **Most direct route:** If you choose the Super Shuttle, they can take you right to the residence hall. Just ask to be let off at Kittredge West Hall. The address there is: **2400 Kittredge Loop Drive, Boulder, CO 80309.**
- **Bus option:** If you choose the RTD SkyRide bus, ask to be let off at Regent Drive and Broadway in Boulder (on the edge of campus). Then walk through campus to Kittredge West Hall.
- **Check-in available 24/hours/day:** It is no problem if you arrive late. (The building is locked at all times. At the entrance, you'll find an intercom and instructions for calling the office.)
- **Campus Map:** You can view a printable copy of our campus map here: <http://www.colorado.edu/campusmap/map.pdf>. You will receive a paper copy at the residence hall when you move in.

Monday evening:

Check-in: When you check in at **Kittredge West Hall** you will receive your room key, dining card, program handbook, and a short note from us. Please note that:

1. The building is locked at all times. Use the intercom to call the front desk for entry. (There are signs telling you what to do.)
2. You will be sharing a room with another Fulbrighter.
3. There are baggage rooms where you may store excess baggage that you will not need during the Gateway.
4. There is a lounge in the residence hall with a television and piano.
5. Smoking is not permitted in housing facilities.
6. All individuals who are under the legal drinking age of 21 may not consume or possess alcohol. Individuals who are of legal drinking age may possess and consume alcohol only in

the privacy of their room with the door closed. Alcohol cannot be consumed or carried in open containers on any street, sidewalk, alley, automobile, or public area on campus.

- **Phones:** Unfortunately there are no pay phones in the residence hall. The closest pay phones are located in the Basemar shopping center (outside of Whole Foods Market) at the corner of Baseline Road and Broadway. The residence hall staff can tell you how to get there.
- **Computer access:** If you've brought your own computer with a wireless card, you can use the university's wireless system. You will receive a login and password when you arrive.

(If you won't have a computer with you, you can find public computers on the second floor of Norlin library on campus.)

- **Dinner:** Monday's dinner is on your own, but there are suggestions of places to eat in your handbook (which you will receive upon arrival).
- **No formal program on Monday:** The first official program activities start on Tuesday morning. However, there is an optional tour of campus at 6:30 pm on Monday (meet in the residence hall lobby).

Tuesday morning:

- **Registration and Breakfast:** At **8:00 am**, some University of Colorado students will walk with you from Kittredge West residence hall to the Center for Community building (C4C).

Registration will begin at 8:15 am on Tuesday morning in the Center for Community, and you will have a cafeteria-style breakfast in the C4C dining hall after registration.

Please bring your passport when you come to registration!
