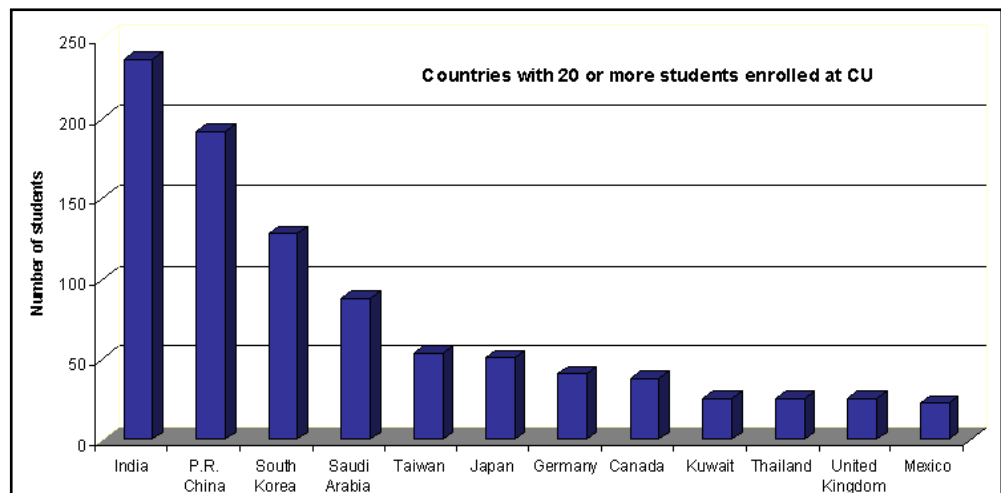
We operated **19 reciprocal student exchange programs** in 2008-2009 with institutions in **12 different countries**.

### International Students and Scholar Services

A total of **1,229 international students** from **83 different countries** were enrolled at the CU-Boulder for the Fall 2008 semester.

International students make up approximately **4%** of the total student population at CU-Boulder.

**67%** of our international students are **graduate** students.



A total of **635 international scholars** (postdocs, researchers, faculty) from **57 countries** participated in either teaching or research at the University of Colorado at Boulder for the 2007-2008 year. (2008-2009 figures will be available in August 2009.)

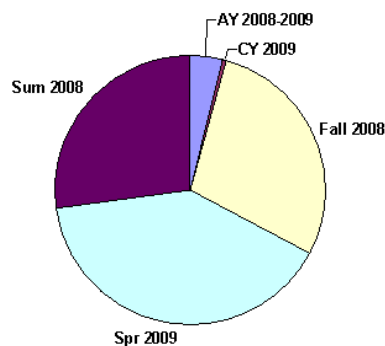
In 2008-2009:

- 1,069 students studied abroad on CU study abroad programs; all but six of the students were CU-Boulder students.
- 62% of CU students who studied abroad were female.
- In the Open Doors report released in November 2008 (for 2007-2008 students), CU-Boulder was ranked 9th among U.S. doctorate institutions for mid-length\* duration of study abroad. (\*mid-length = one semester or one or two quarters; report available at <http://opendoors.iienetwork.org/>)
- CU Study Abroad Programs offered approximately 260 study abroad programs in over 65 countries. They offered opportunities for undergraduates, graduates, MBA students and law students.
