REMINDER REGARDING THE NIH PUBLIC ACCESS POLICY

Effective April 7, 2008, all peer-reviewed articles funded in whole, or in part, by the NIH must be submitted to the National Library of Medicine's PubMed Central digital archive within one year of publication. The Principal Investigator is responsible for ensuring that his or her articles and any article prepared by a member of the project team are submitted in accordance with the policy.

When submitting to a journal that will not automatically forward articles to PubMed, you and your colleagues will need to 1) inform the journal that the article is subject to the Public Access Policy, 2) ensure that any copyright transfer or other publication agreement allows the article to be submitted to PubMed. To help you protect your academic rights and fulfill your responsibilities to NIH, we strongly encourage you to include a version of the draft copyright/publication agreement linked below with any manuscript submitted for publication.

Beginning May 25, 2008, authors must include PubMed Central ID numbers in NIH applications and reports when citing their articles covered by the policy. This includes all articles accepted for publication in a journal on or after April 7, 2008 and arise from direct funding from an NIH Grant or Cooperative Agreement active during the Federal Fiscal Year 2008 (October 1, 2007 forward) or by a contract active on or after April 7, 2008. If the articles are not cited correctly, then funding may be delayed, or even denied.
