What is a Postbaccalaureate Program?

In recent years medical schools have increased the number of students who are entering their programs a year or more after graduating from college. The average age nationwide is 24 and in the last few years the University of Colorado School of Medicine has accepted less than 20% of the class directly after completing their undergraduate degree. As a result, rushing to apply to medical school without thoughtful consideration of your preparation is often not a successful strategy. In response to this

changing demographic in medical school admission, there has also been an increase in “postbaccalaureate” programs. A postbaccalaureate program is simply defined as any academic program that occurs after the bachelor’s degree, but there is a wide range of programs designed to fit a wide variety of needs. A postbaccalaureate program can sometimes be helpful to increase chances of admission for: those who are considering a career change, those who need academic enhancement to meet the admissions requirements, and those who are from groups underrepresented in the health professions or from disadvantaged backgrounds. Types of Programs:

Career Change Programs: These programs are specifically intended for individuals that have a bachelor’s degree, but lack the necessary prerequisite courses for medical school. Often individuals who choose these programs have completed their degree and worked in a different field for a period of time, but now want to change careers and enter medical school. Within these types of postbaccalaureate programs, there are a range of options, including both formal and informal programs. The formal programs typically have a proscribed sequence of courses and are clearly defined. Some of these formal programs are very selective in their applicants and therefore their rates of acceptance into medical school are quite high. A few of these programs may also be linked to specific medical schools, and provide an advantage for students in the program that are applying to that medical school. Other formal programs are less selective and therefore have a lower acceptance rate into medical school. The informal programs are often offered by universities that welcome continuing education students into their classes and offer the necessary prerequisites for medical school. In these programs, individual students are responsible for their own progression and course planning. At the University of Colorado at Boulder, postbaccalaureate students have the same access to the Prehealth Advising Office services as undergraduate students and alumni.

Academic Enhancement Programs: These programs are designed to give students a chance to improve a weak academic record, and are usually intended for individuals who already have most, if not all of the prerequisite courses for medical school. Students in these programs may have struggled academically early in their college years, or have had a particular semester that caused a decline in their GPA. Additionally, they may have a lower MCAT score and these characteristics are making it difficult for them to gain admission to medical school. This type of program is appropriate for individuals who are capable of doing the coursework and successfully increasing their GPA or MCAT score. Academic enhancement programs can offer either undergraduate or graduate courses. Students are often advised to take graduate courses if they have a major in the sciences and have taken a wide range of science courses in addition to the medical school prerequisite courses. However, students who have taken only the prerequisite courses and few other sciences may find upper level undergraduate courses more beneficial. This is a decision to be made in consultation with your prehealth advisor.

Underrepresented Minority and Economically Disadvantaged Programs: The American Association of Medical Colleges (AAMC) believes that both medical education and health care delivery benefit from diversity among medical students and physicians. The AAMC recognizes that diversity encompasses a variety of factors, including race and ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic status, and life experiences. While any of the academic enhancement or career change programs could be beneficial to students who are members of groups underrepresented in medicine, there are programs specifically designed for these students. These programs all fall under the category of academic enhancement and are focused on providing aid and support on the road to medical school. These programs may also offer additional financial aid, mentoring, research opportunities and MCAT prep. Many of these programs are small in size, offer a great deal of support and have good success rates.

Dental Programs: For students interested in dentistry, there are programs that are either specific for dental schools or programs that are designed for those interested in many of the health professions. If you are interested in pursuing a career in dentistry, but lack most of the basic requirements, then a postbaccalaureate in the “career changer” category will be the best fit. It is important to remember that the requirements for dental school are different from those for medical school, so you must look carefully at the flexibility of the program and the classes that are offered. For those who already have a number of the prerequisites, there are academic enhancement programs designed to provide advanced coursework and, in some cases, test preparation. Some of these programs are specific to dentistry, while others are a more general prehealth program. The more common dental programs are listed below. It is recommended that you consult with your prehealth advisor before attending one of these programs to be sure that you will obtain the qualifications necessary to apply for dental school.

Veterinary Programs: For students interested in veterinary medicine, there are only two postbaccalaureate programs that are specific to veterinary school. However, many of the programs for medical school would be appropriate for veterinary school as well. If you are interested in pursuing a career in veterinary medicine, but lack most of the basic requirements, then a postbaccalaureate in the “career changer” category will most likely work well for you. It is important to remember that the requirements for veterinary school are different from those for medical school, so you must look carefully at the flexibility of the program and the classes that are offered. For those who already have a number of the prerequisites, there are academic enhancement programs designed to provide advanced coursework that will be relevant to both medical and veterinary school. The two specific veterinary programs are listed below. It is strongly recommended that you consult with your prehealth advisor before attending one of these programs to be sure that you will obtain the qualifications necessary to apply for veterinary school.

Should You Consider a Postbaccalaureate Program?

For those individuals who are interested in a career change and need the prerequisite courses for medical school, some type of postbaccalaureate program is often appropriate. In this case, the next step is to determine if you are interested in a formal or informal program, and how structured the program should be. A prehealth advisor can be helpful in this process. For those individuals who are interested in academic enhancement, the decision of whether or not to do postbaccalaureate work can be a difficult one. It is important to understand where academic enhancement is needed and if a postbaccalaureate program could help. Students with an upward trend in their GPA, or whose GPA is lower due to a difficult semester are often quite successful in a postbaccalaureate program. However, students who have consistently performed at a C level in their undergraduate work will need to make significant changes in their study skills to be successful in a postbaccalaureate program. A prehealth advisor can be helpful in the decision process as well as provide information on particular programs. However, the ultimate decision of whether or not to participate in postbaccalaureate programs is up to the individual student.
