STATEMENT OF FACULTY RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Faculty who accuse students of misconduct are expected to participate conscientiously in the conduct process. These responsibilities include reading the Honor Code Constitution and Bylaws, available from the Honor Code Office or online at www.colorado.edu/honorcode/, adhering to stated deadlines, and participating in proceedings.

1. Faculty members are expected to submit students believed responsible for violating the University of Colorado's Honor Code to the Honor Code office by either filling out a violation or accusation form.
2. The faculty member is expected to provide accurate and honest information about incidents and accused students.
3. The faculty member is expected to inform the student that they are being turned in for a violation.
4. The faculty member is expected to cooperate with the Honor Code and facilitate the completion of the investigation process and hearing procedure and to communicate in a timely manner.
5. Both the accused student and the reporting individual will be allowed to review all available written information concerning the violation of the Honor Code.
6. The faculty member will be asked to attend the accused student's hearing.
7. The faculty member will be allowed to present a limited number of witnesses in her/his behalf. The faculty member must inform the hearing body of the names of such witnesses 24 hours before the hearing, if his/her intention is to bring a witness(es).
8. The faculty may not cancel a hearing within 24 hours of the hearing. The hearing will continue in the faculty member's absence.
9. Faculty member will have the opportunity to review the investigation report taken by an Honor Code investigator.
10. The faculty member will receive written notice of the panel's decision concerning the case.
11. The faculty member may request an appeal of the decision of the hearing panel. All requests for appeal must be filed in writing within 10 class days of the hearing panel decision for an appeal based on inconsistencies with the hearing process and/or emergence of new evidence. The *Request for Appeal* shall be filed with the Honor Code Office. The *Request for Appeal* form is available from the Honor Code Office or the Honor Code website.
