Aerospace Engineering Instrument Shop Safety Compliance Contract^{***}

Strict Safety Rules

For the safety of others and myself in the Aerospace Engineering Instrument Shop, I agree to strictly adhere to the following safety rules:

- Safety Glasses* I will wear OSHA-approved safety glasses at all times while in the Aerospace Engineering Instrument Shop. If I wear regular prescription glasses, I will wear safety goggles over them.
- Jewelry I will remove all rings (excluding wedding rings), necklaces, bracelets and dangling earrings before operating any machinery or tools.
- ► Loose Hair or Clothing I understand that loose hair and clothing are extremely dangerous in the shop environment. While in the Instrument Shop, I will tuck in my shirt, roll up long sleeves and tie back my hair.
- ▶ No Open-Toe Shoes I will not wear open-toe shoes (such as sandals) and shoes not entirely covering both of my feet, while I am in the Instrument Shop. Steel-toe shoes are the most protective, but closed-toe leather shoes and tennis shoes are acceptable.
- Clean Up I will clean the machine and any mess (sawdust, metal chips, spills, etc.) that I produced before leaving the Instrument Shop. Clean means the next machine user is unable to determine the material(s) I was using.
- Return of Tools and Parts I will promptly return any tools, parts, bits, etc., to their proper "home" in the Instrument Shop.

Guidelines for Safe Behavior^{More} ^{■>}

• I will obtain permission from the shop manager *before* operating any machines or tools.

- I will follow the proper operating procedures when using any machinery, and I will become familiar with each machine's capabilities and controls.
- I will be courteous to others working around me.
 - I will not engage in disruptive conversation.

- I will ensure that my actions will not interfere with others or their work area, especially when using pressurized air guns, generating hot chips or splashing cutting fluids.

- I will not enter the Instrument Shop while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
 I will not operate machinery if on medication. I understand that many over-the-counter remedies warn against their use when operating machinery. If I have consumed any amount of alcohol within the last 8 hours, or returned from a doctor/dental appointment and am under the influence of medication I will NOT operate any Instrument Shop machinery.
- To prevent injury, I will never remove the guards or safety equipment from machinery. The only exception is for wheel or cutter replacement, and I will turn off the power before doing this.
- I will not touch, clean, or oil machines, or place my body in contact with a running machine. I will make sure that a machine is *completely off* before making adjustments or performing maintenance tasks.
- If a machine makes an unusual noise or acts in a suspicious manner, I will shut it down immediately and notify the shop manager.
- I will immediately report *any injury* to the shop manager, regardless of how minor it may seem.

My Commitment

- By my signature below, I certify that I have read and agree to comply with the above Aerospace Engineering Instrument Shop safety rules.
- I am aware that there is a priority schedule and job pipeline for the Instrument Shop. The shop manager makes job priority decisions, and these are final.
- I realize that I will be asked to leave the Instrument Shop for non-compliance with any of the above rules. Should that happen, I will willingly leave.
- I acknowledge that I have an obligation to keep the Instrument Shop tools and machinery in good working condition. I am financially responsible for replacement or repair of tools I damage through neglect or willful harm.
