

**CALL FOR CHA FELLOWS  
2012-2013**

The Center for Humanities and the Arts (CHA) invites all Assistant and Associate Professors in the Humanities and the Arts to apply to become a CHA Fellow during the 2012–2013 academic year. Fellowships consist of a two-course teaching reduction, either to be taken in one semester or spread over the academic year. The selection committee will consider the intellectual merit of the project, the overall excellence of the applicant's academic record, and the timeliness of the project in the applicant's career. The selection committee consists of three senior humanists/artists unaffiliated with CU-Boulder.

***Application Procedure:***

Please complete items 1–5 below and e-mail as a PDF file to Paula Anderson at [paula.anderson@colorado.edu](mailto:paula.anderson@colorado.edu), or submit hard copy to her in Macky 201.

- 1) A cover letter indicating your preference for a semester without teaching (and which semester) or reduced teaching through the year;
- 2) A one-paragraph description of your research project and its state of completion;
- 3) A maximum five page (1.5 or double-spaced) detailed description of your research project. The applications will be read by scholars from a variety of humanistic disciplines and should be written with non-specialists in mind;
- 4) A curriculum vitae of no more than 4 pages;
- 5) Two letters of recommendation: one from the department chair (in support of the project and noting approval of the two-course release), and one from a scholar in your field (preferably external). ***Expectations:***

Upon completion of the fellowship, CHA Fellows are expected to:

- 1) present a workshop on their research;
- 2) submit a final report on research completed and plans for publication;
- 3) contribute a short piece on the research to be included in *Consortium: A Journal of Crossdisciplinary Inquiry*, the Undergraduate/Graduate Journal at CU-Boulder.
