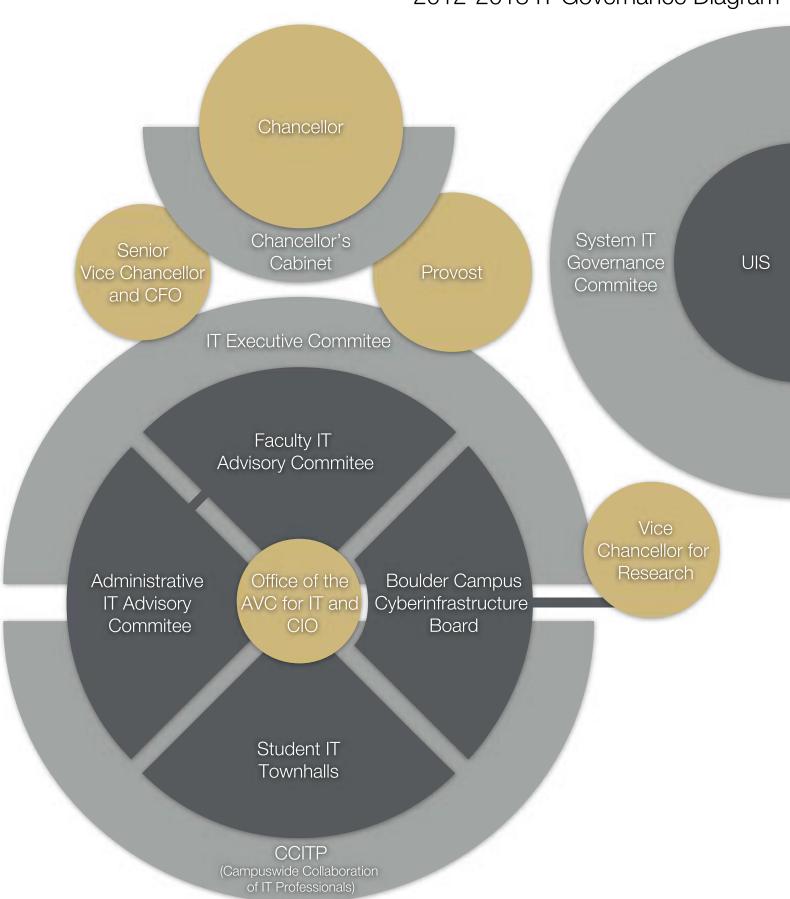


Shaping IT Direction Through Engaged Participation and Shared Governance

IT Executive Advisory Committee

This senior leadership group comprises seven members at the associate dean level or higher. The head of each of the following offices attends or selects a member: Provost (selects two: one faculty member and one from the Provost's Office), SVC/CFO, VC for Administration, VC for Student Affairs, VC for Strategic Relations, and University Counsel. This committee is chaired by the AVC for IT/CIO, supported by the Director of Communication & Support, and meets quarterly to raise, review, and endorse strategy, policies, and directions in coordination with the four advisory committees. Additionally, this committee apprises the CEC regarding campus-wide IT issues as requested by the CEC.

Faculty IT Advisory Committee

This committee typically has 15 members: three selected from A&S and one member from each of the other Schools and Colleges in addition to (at the BFA's discretion) the chair of the BFA Administrative Services and Technology committee and two at-large BFA members. Deans make selections for Schools and Colleges, BFA for BFA members. Initially each member serves either two or three years, randomly selected, to create a mixed rotation schedule, and then three years thereafter. This committee is chaired by the AVCIT/CIO, supported by the Director of Academic Technology. This representative group of faculty may develop subgroups (e.g. Faculty Evaluating Educational Technology, or FEET) as necessary. This committee meets at least every other month (September through May) to help ensure that IT services and support enhance learning, teaching, and research, meet the instructional and research needs of faculty and instructors, and are coordinated across academic and service units. Members are expected to confer with their colleagues, provide input by suggesting issues for the committee to address, and consider issues presented by the AVCIT/CIO and Director of AT. The committee provides advice and assessment associated with the deployment of new technology services and spaces, the evaluation of the effectiveness of technology in teaching and learning, and the support of academic technologies, as well as any IT matters that may affect the needs of faculty.

Administrative IT Advisory Committee

This committee typically has 14 members from academic and administrative support areas including A&S, Engineering, Continuing Education, UIS (two attend), Enrollment Services, Contracts and Grants, Human Resources, Faculty Affairs, Housing & Dining Services, Continuing Education, Institutional Research, and Public Health and Safety. The AVC for IT/CIO chairs and is supported by the Director of IT Service Engineering. This committee meets at least every other month. Members are expected to confer with their colleagues, provide input by suggesting issues for the committee to address, and consider issues presented by the AVCIT/CIO and Director of AT. The committee provides advice and assessment associated with how campus IT assets (systems and data) are deployed and managed to meet campus administrative needs.

Student IT Advisory Town Halls

The AVC for IT/CIO, supported by the Director of Communication & Support holds student town hall meetings three times a year. A member of the executive branch of the UCSG and a member of the UGGS will attend as well as an open invitation to both graduate and undergraduates. These discussions will provide direct student input to the AVCIT/CIO on student IT strategic, priority, and policy matters. Additionally, through the UCSG and/or UGGS this committee could apprise the CEC on IT issues as they relate to the student experience as requested by the CEC.

Boulder Campus Cyberinfrastructure Board

This committee, instantiated and charged by the Provost, is chaired by the VCR and supported by the Director of Research Computing. This committee provides oversight for the development and management of a campus-wide collaborative research-computing environment. Frequencies of meetings are determined by the committee, and are typically held each month.

Campus-wide Collaboration of IT Professional/Partners CCITP

This group comprises approximately 80 IT professionals from three core areas: schools and colleges, research institutes, and administrative departments, including auxiliaries. Each area has approximately six "seats" with the members rotating depending on the agenda, along with OIT and UIS representation, creating a monthly forum of 25-30 members. Three coordinators, one from each area, coordinate who attends. This group meets monthly and has additional subcommittee meetings. Topics, typically technical, are wide ranging and the group provides a technical vetting and advising function to OIT and to the other governance groups.
