What is SAG?

- A group of students representing most CU-LEAD academic neighborhoods who meet regularly to discuss matters regarding CU-LEAD

Mission:

- Advise the CU-LEAD Alliance directors on their stated goals and objectives
- Serve as a liaison between students involved in CU-LEAD Alliance programs and the CU-LEAD Alliance directors

History:

- Established in Fall 2003 upon CU-LEAD Management Team discussion

SAG Priorities of CU-LEAD Alliance Goals:

- Increase recruitment, retention and graduation rates for students of color and first generation students
- Facilitate increased sense of community for students of color and first generation students and provide with additional resources for success
- Establish and strengthen community between CU-LEAD students and faculty of color
