FIFTY-SIXTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE ON WORLD AFFAIRS
ANNOUNCES PLENARY ADDRESS:

THE POLITICS OF TERROR

(Boulder) – March 29, 2004 – S. Azmat Hassan, career diplomat in the service of Pakistan and currently an Ambassador-in-Residence at the John C. Whitehead School of Diplomacy and International Relations, will deliver a plenary speech on “The Politics of Terror” to the Conference on World Affairs on Tuesday, April 6 at 2 p.m. in Old Main Chapel.

Ambassador Hassan will draw upon his extensive diplomatic experience to trace the historical evolution of terrorism, including the September 11 attacks on the United States. The Ambassador says he will address “how the United States and other nations can work both individually and collectively to curb the menace of international terrorism. I will also discuss the enhanced responsibility placed on the United Nations system to devise effective counter-terrorism measures.”

Over the course of his career, Ambassador Hassan has served on the staff of the Prime Minister of Pakistan as Additional Secretary for Foreign Affairs and Defense, as official representative of Pakistan to the United Nations, as well as Pakistan’s Ambassador to Malaysia, Syria and, most recently, Morocco. A frequent commentator on international affairs for television and radio, Hassan writes widely on foreign affairs for the international press.
