Section 1: Content Requirements

The requirements below reflect the content knowledge all candidates will be accountable for as secondary Japanese teachers. Students should plan their coursework carefully such that they may complete requirements for their degree and the Content Requirements concurrently. It is *not* required that students complete all the content coursework in order to apply for admission, but all requirements must be completed *prior* to the student teaching semester. In order to fulfill a requirement below, the course must be: a) Completed for a grade (no Pass/Fail) b) Completed with a grade of “C-“ or higher.

Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and transfer credits may be applied towards the content requirements. However, this is dependent upon how the College of Arts & Sciences awards equivalency for these credits. Major exemptions to the Arts & Sciences Core requirements might not apply to the Teacher Education Program.

All applications to the teacher licensure program will be evaluated against the requirements below. Upon admission, all students will receive a completed copy of their checklist which will show the requirements that have already been fulfilled, and those that the student still needs to complete.

Enrollment in both of these courses is restricted to students that have completed 30 semester hours of college-level credit.

Satisfactory completion of all Content Requirements and Education Requirements is a prerequisite for Student Teaching. You must also pass the PLACE Content Japanese Assessment (Test Code: 15), *prior* to student teaching. Student Teaching is a full-time, in-school commitment. The following courses must be taken concurrently.
