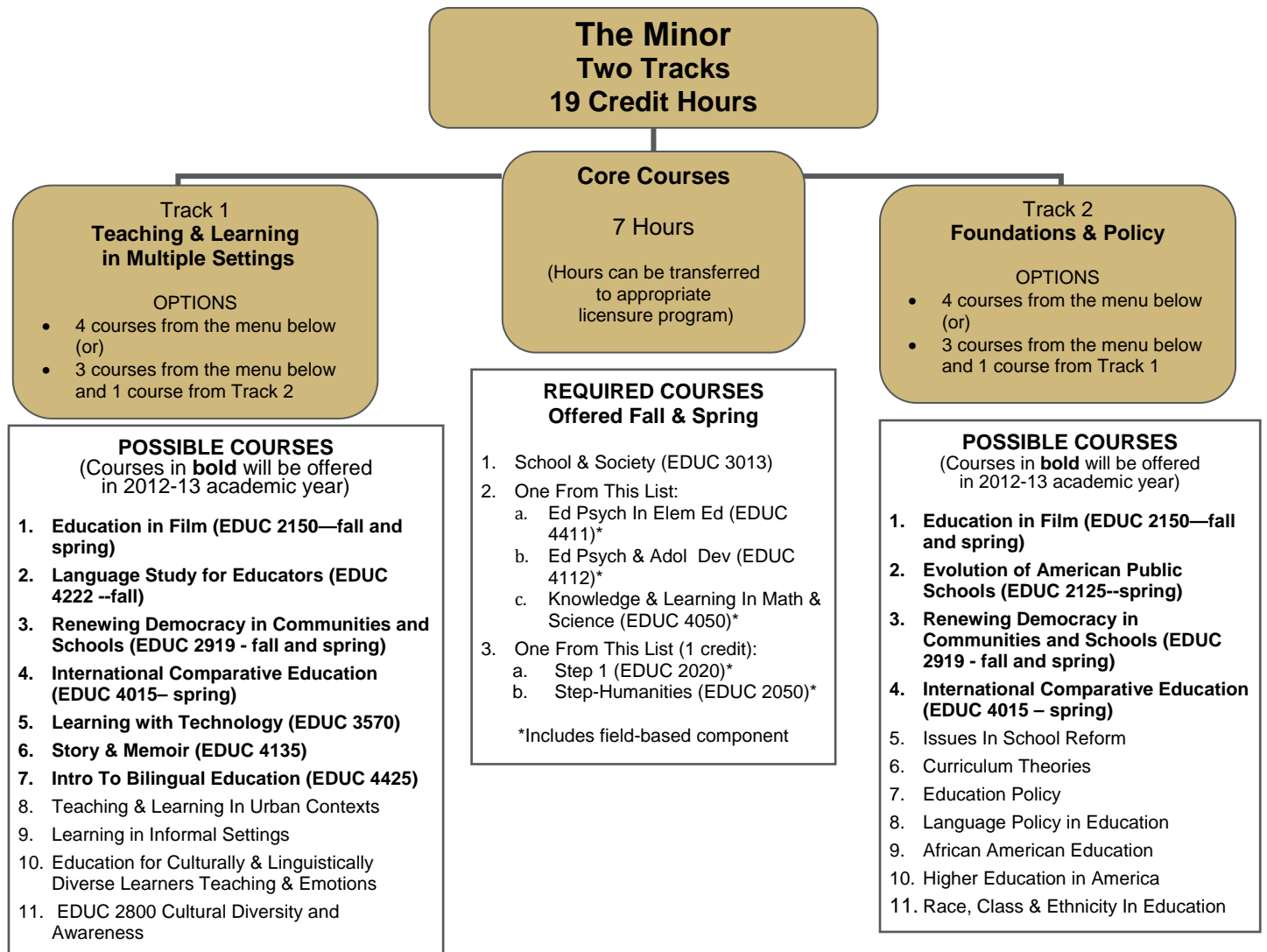




- Introduce students to the complex interactions among the various political, cultural, social, and historical dynamics that shape educational policy and practice.
