Pesticides: All plants in the greenhouses are subject to treatment with pesticides unless the researcher places obvious signs to the contrary on the research plants **and** informs the greenhouse manager. Please respect any signs on greenhouse doors that advise against entry unless re-entry time has passed.

Headhouses and greenhouses: It is really important for users of the greenhouse to clean up after working and to remove all personal belongings. Any unlabeled beakers, markers, graduated cylinders, etc. left in the greenhouse will be gathered and utilized by greenhouse staff.

Your responsibilities: Please notify the greenhouse manager when you start and terminate your project. Space utilization is often planned in advance, so please notify ASAP if a project is expected to run beyond the estimated duration. Do not bring any diseased or arthropod-infested plants into the greenhouse. The present policy is that all research plants are watered by researchers or their assistants. **All personnel from your lab, Department or elsewhere who use the greenhouse should read the Greenhouse Policy thoroughly and abide by all protocols.** Please contact the greenhouse manager if you have questions:
