Digital Globe Undergraduate Award in Geospatial Science

Award Amount \$5,000

Application Deadline Monday 18 April

Award Announced at Geography Graduation 6 May 2016

Digital Globe captures and sells multi-resolution satellite imagery and geospatial content, operating civilian remote sensing platforms. The company maintains current and historical geospatial imagery collections, and creates specialized map and imagery products using state-of-the-art spatial analysis and cartography. Their crowdsourcing platform Tomnod has played a major role in search and rescue services, as for example in the public help searching for the missing Malaysia Air flight 370.



To be awarded to a promising junior or senior who intends to pursue a career in geospatial sciences. Competition is repeated annually.



Eligibility: Undergraduate Geography Majors who hold junior or

senior standing, plan to graduate in 2016 or 2017, and have completed at least two upper division courses in GIScience, Remote Sensing, Cartography or Statistics by the end of Spring 2016. Previous winners are not eligible for consideration.

Application Packet: 1) Prepare a 300 word statement describing relevant coursework; mention any special projects working with geospatial technology, or relevant experience. Discuss your career plans, and how your GIScience education will help you to make a contribution after you graduate. State how the award will help you to achieve your career goals. 2) Request a copy of your transcript (unofficial is okay). 3) Ask any faculty member in CU Geography to send a brief email statement of support for your application. *All materials must be submitted in electronic form to leslie.yakubowski@colorado.edu no later than Monday 18 April. Put your last name and the word DigitalGlobe in the subject header.* A panel of CU Geography faculty will review applications and announce the winner at Geography's May commencement ceremony.



The award carries no obligation to Digital Globe, although students may be given an opportunity to work or intern at the company (local offices in Longmont, Colorado).
