# **Clara the Costume Designer**

Clara Geoghegan, a CU freshman and Smith Hall resident, has always enjoyed crafting. "Ever since I was a kid, I liked to be creative, and I liked to do weird things playwise, like I would always make strange houses for my dolls."

Nowadays, Geoghegan really enjoys making intricate costumes. "If you find a character in a film you really like, you can always buy the costume, but it's really fun to make it from scrap.... it becomes more personal."

She starts by deciding which character to model, "somebody who you kind of want to be, or somebody who you aspire to." Next, she decides which aspects of the character's clothing she wants to replicate and draws out a pattern, trying to be as accurate as possible. She creates a prototype with cheap fabric and finishes by sewing the real thing.

Geoghegan delights in wearing her costumes as much as she enjoys creating them. "Whenever you dress up as a character, it's like you're taking on their personality, and sometimes that's really empowering."

Costumes Geoghegan has made include a character called Elizabeth Compton from the video game *BioShock Infinite* and Princess Mononoke.
