Alum Spotlight: George Codding's Volunteer Career in International Arson Investigation

George A. Codding, son of former International Affairs Director and CU professor George Codding, Jr., has kept an interest in global issues in the family. Codding, '84 alum of International Affairs and Political Science and '89 alum of the School of Law, has built a volunteer career beyond his current position in the Colorado Attorney General's Office.



A volunteer firefighter for 27 years, Codding became interested in fire and

arson investigation. He has investigated fires for his local fire department in Louisville and in Boulder County since 1998. Through his work, he became involved in the International Association of Arson Investigators (IAAI). IAAI has 8,300 members in 66 countries involved in the investigation of fires, including police and fire department members, scientists, engineers, attorneys, insurance personnel, and investigators. Currently the IAAI 1st Vice President, Codding will become IAAI President for a year starting April 2016.

Counterterrorism Expert Mark Fallon on Campus April 7th

Mark Fallon joins the upcoming 68th Conference on World Affairs at CU-Boulder, and will also give a special presentation at the International Affairs Spring Welcome Reception on April 7th. Fallon is the Director of ClubFed, providing strategic consulting services on international security matters.

Fallon has been involved in some of the most significant counterterrorism operations in U.S. history, including the investigation of Sheik Omar Abdel Rahman and the attack on the USS Cole. After the attacks of 9/11, he was appointed as the Deputy Commander of a task force created to specifically investigate the al-Qaida terrorist network.

Fallon serves as the Chair of the U.S. Government's High Value Detainee Interrogation Group Research Committee and is the Vice Chair of the International Association of Chiefs of Police IMPACT Executive Committee. He has appeared as an international security commentator on networks that include the BBC, Al Jazeera, Chanel News Asia, Russia Today, CNN, Fox News, MSNBC and the Huffington Post.
