

BUSSIAN FELLOWSHIP FOR INTERNATIONAL LAW & DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The Bussian Fellowship for International Law and Dispute Resolution is awarded annually to up to three CU Law students to pursue summer opportunities in the fields of international law and dispute resolution (including judicial settlement, arbitration, negotiation, mediation, conciliation, conflict resolution and peace studies). Fellowships up to \$3000 may be awarded through a competitive selection process based on academic achievement, demonstrated interest in the field and financial need. Students may use the funding for program costs, travel and living expenses to pursue summer opportunities (including internships, externships, academic study abroad programs and employment opportunities). Graduating law students (3Ls and LLMS) are also eligible to apply.

Application Process

Please submit the following application materials in one packet to the Assistant Dean for Students, Whiting Leary's office:

1. 1-2 page Statement of Interest explaining your eligibility, qualifications and the reason for your interest in the Fellowship
2. CV or resume
3. Current CU Law transcript
4. Three references who may be contacted on your behalf (from professors and/or former employers)
5. Proof of summer opportunity (typically a copy of your application to a program or letter confirming your summer position)
6. A complete list of other sources of summer funding applied for, pending and/or received

Applications are due by 5 p.m. on April 1 of the applicable year. Selections are made by the Faculty Review Committee and candidates will be notified by April 15. Upon completion, Fellows are required to submit a report detailing their summer experience to Professor Anna Spain at anna.spain@colorado.edu, which will be kept on file for review by future candidates.
