



Current Cross-listed CU courses

Colorado Law students may earn credit towards their graduation for up to six credit hours taken in other departments of the University of Colorado. Under Miscellaneous Rule 22, a student may petition to have a non-law course cross-listed in the Law School curriculum for credit.
