

Colorado State Capitol

The conference is in the Old Supreme Court Chambers located at the north end of the second floor of the Colorado Capitol, which is on the south side of Colfax Avenue between Lincoln and Grant Streets in Denver. Parkin within walking distance is plentiful. There is a garage at 17th and Lincoln, a surface parking lot at 16th and smaller lots on Grant and Logan between 16th and 19th Avenues.

The Capitol can be entered by ascending the steps on its north side to the main floor or by entering at ground level on the south side. Both doors open at 7:30 a.m. There is elevator service between all floors.

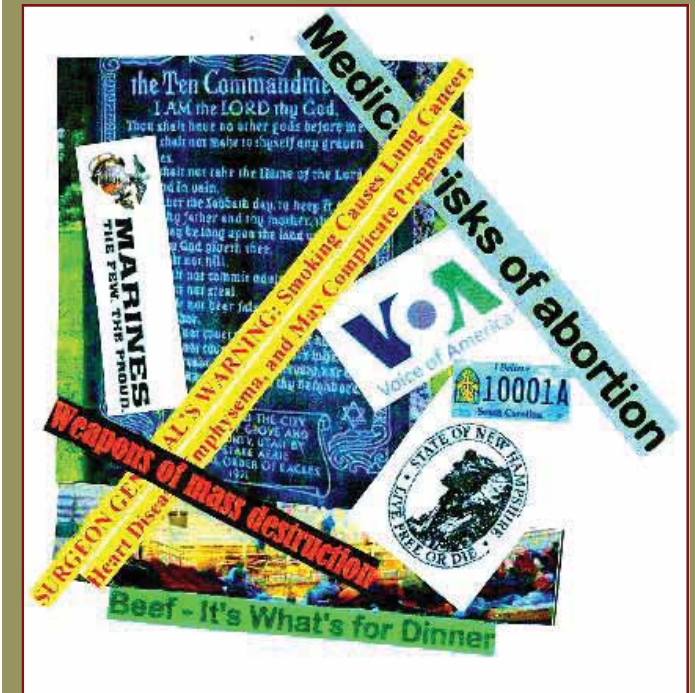
