A student who satisfies all of the course requirements for the Certificate will be awarded the certificate if the student earned at least a 72 in each course designated by the student as satisfying the Certificate requirements. A student who satisfies all of the course requirements for the Certificate would be awarded the certificate "with honors" if the student earned a cumulative grade point average of at least an 86 in courses designated by the student as satisfying the certificate requirements.
