

Title: Summer WASH, Pneumonia & Nutrition Internship

Summary:

Save the Children is seeking an intern for the summer of 2017 (est.: 6/5/17 to 8/5/17) focusing on the intersection of water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) with Pneumonia and Nutrition. The intern will assist the WASH program manager with several research projects and investigating non-traditional donors that could partner with SCUS on a WASH-Nutrition-Pneumonia strategy

Responsibilities:

1. Research links between WASH, Nutrition, and Pneumonia.
2. Run data analyses on existing data sets related to WASH and Nutrition
3. Research non-traditional donors and partners from the clean energy and clean cookstove sectors that might be interested in collaborating with SCUS.
4. Meet daily or as needed with WASH program manager.
5. Report weekly on activities and results.

Requirements:

1. Currently working on an undergraduate or graduate degree in Public Health or similar field
2. Interest in global environmental health and/or nutrition
3. Experience using statistical software.
4. Independent and hardworking.
5. Good communication skills.
