<b>Admission Criteria</b>	Underrepresented Multicultural Student and First Generation Students <u>accepted and enrolled in the College of Architecture and Planning.</u> CAPDWB Application Participation Contract – student agrees to participate in CAPDWB activities. Maintain 3.0 GPA
<b>Feeder Programs</b>	To be determined.
<b>Individual Award Amount</b>	\$1,500 per academic year for incoming freshmen/transfers; the award is renewable based on CAPDWB participation.
<b>Additional Incentives</b>	To be determined.
<b>Support Activities</b>	CAP DWB extracurricular activities in the College. Multicultural activities outside of the college May be within the university or community at large. (Other CU-LEAD Programs)
<b>Leadership Activities</b>	Participation in several activities throughout the semester; Serve as mentor to other CAP diversity students. Work and meet with other CU-LEAD groups during the year. Actively participate in a student group on campus or in the college to help promote diversity.
