Printing Your Electronic I-94

- Go to https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov
- Click on "Get Most Recent I-94"



Enter information as it appears on the visa utilized to enter the U.S. or passport for Canadian citizens and click on "Next"


When entering your First (Given) Name, do not include middle names, nicknames, or titles.

If you are unable to access your I-94 using your visa information, try entering your name:

- As it appears on your passport biographic page
- As it appears in the passport Machine Readable Zone

(e.g., F-1, J-1, H-1B)

As it appears on your airline ticket/ itinerary



Admit Until Date for F & J Status D/S (Duration of Status)

- Review and print your electronic I-94 every time you re-enter the U.S. to ensure that the information is accurate and matches your other immigration documents. Do the same for your dependents.
 - Keep your I-94 printouts to document your maintenance of status. You do not have to turn them in when you depart the U.S.
 - Exception: To prove eligibility for automatic visa revalidation, you should travel with your I-94.




If You are Unable to Retrieve Your Electronic I-94 Record Or Require an I-94 Correction

- Try entering your name and birthdate in different configurations
 - e.g., with your middle name, without your middle name
- Use the Centralized Traveler Communication Center (TCC) via the "Ask a Question" web page to ask Customs and Border Protection (CBP) to correct any errors in your electronic travel history or Form I-94 records.
 - If you do not receive a response in 5-7 business days, please contact the Denver International Airport (DIA) by following the instructions below.
- ➢ If you are still unable to access your I-94 or if you require an I-94 correction, go to the Denver International Airport (DIA) to meet with a Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Officer
 - Monday-Friday in the 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. (It is recommended to arrive in the 10 a.m. to noon timeframe)
 - Main Jeppesen Terminal- Level 5- Northeast end (International Arrivals)
 - Bring your I-20 or DS-2019, passport, passport entry stamp, visa, and most recent airline ticket/itinerary.
 - When you get to CBP, use the phone next to the door to call for assistance.
- If you have questions, contact CPB at (303) 342-7400.
 - Press 3 regarding Denver CBP I-94 Corrections.
 - Press 4 to speak with an officer.

Getting to the Denver International Airport (DIA):

 - You will have to pay the bus fare (exact change) for the ride to the airport and another bus fare (exact change) to return from the airport.
