The police have been identifying and investigating possible suspects in the high-profile burglary case involving the theft of a valuable, autographed John Elway jersey. Your preliminary results of physical evidence from the scene have been very helpful. As a result of your report, the police realized that the burglary probably involved two perpetrators. They are keeping the previously arrested male suspect in custody. In addition, they have narrowed the list of other suspects to three people. They are:

Miss Daphne Swinton

Miss Swinton is the girlfriend of the male suspect who tried to sell the jersey at a local sports collectibles store. She claims to have no knowledge of the incident. She claims that she was running errands all day, but, so far, the police can find no witnesses to confirm her alibi.

Miss Anabelle Lucas

Miss Lucas is also a girlfriend of the male suspect in question. She was not aware that he was also seeing Daphne Swinton. She claims that she was home all day with a migraine headache. Like Ms. Swinton, she claims to have no knowledge of the incident. Ms. Lucas has one prior arrest for shop-lifting.

Mrs. Lucy Jardino

Mrs. Jardino is the sister of the male suspect in question. She admits that she was with him part of the day – helping him clean his apartment before he moved out. She says that she left around 11:00 a.m. that day, and that she didn't see her brother after that. Mrs. Jardino and her family have been experiencing financial difficulties, and the police suspect that she may have seen the burglary as a means to get some easy money.

The police have gathered the following from each suspect:

- 1.) Samples of their hair and the hair of their pets, if applicable.
- 2.) Samples of their lipstick and lip prints.
- 3.) Blood.

You will be asked to analyze these samples and compare them to the evidence collected from the scene. The samples from the three suspects and the evidence sample have been labeled A-D. You will not be allowed to know which suspects the letters correspond to until after you have made your conclusions.
