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One option for the new doctoral regalia would feature Colorado's official colors of silver and gold. Photos ([click here to view](#)), which Dr. Alphonse Keasley has kindly provided, show the Ph.D. gown: gold with dark blue lapels and stripes, bordered with silver. Juris doctor regalia would have lapels and stripes in the traditional purple velvet; medical doctors would have the traditional kelly/hunter green lapels and stripes. Hoods would continue to reflect the traditional colors of the particular academic discipline.
