DISTRIBUTED MAJORS with Physics as Primary Subject

The distributed major consists of a total of 60 semester hours earned in two or three areas, all of which must be within the College of Arts and Sciences (may not include Physical Education, Education, Business, Engineering, etc. as one subject).

Primary Subject: The primary area must contain a minimum of 30 semester hours. No more than 30 hours may be required. The grade point average in the primary subject must be at least 2.0; 30 hours of work must carry grades of C- or better; 15 hours must be in upper division courses in which grades of C- or better have been earned. The specific course requirements for a primary subject in physics are essentially those described in Plan 2 of this brochure.

Secondary Subjects: Students may choose either one or two secondary subjects.

- (i) One secondary subject. This requires a minimum of 30 hours in one department. The grade point average in the subject must be at least 2.0; 30 hours of work must carry grades of C- or better; 15 hours must be upper division courses with grades of C- or better.
- (ii) Two secondary subjects. This requires a minimum of 15 hours in each of two departments. A grade point average of 2.0 or better must be maintained in each department. 15 hours in each department must have grades of C- or better. 9 hours in each department must be upper division courses with grades of C- or better.

Language Courses: No first-year course in a foreign language or English language (composition) may be used to fulfill the requirements of the Distributed Studies major.
