University of Colorado Police are investigating reports of indecent exposure incidents that occurred at the Smiley Court Apartment Complex, 1300 30th Street, on 7-21-09.

At 2:20 p.m., University Police were called from a resident of the Smiley Court Apartment complex. The resident said an elderly male had just exposed himself to the resident's 7-year-old daughter. The resident provided a description, and officers responded to the area to search for the male. Officers were unable to locate the male.

Officers learned that the 7-year-old girl and her brother had gone to a park in the Smiley Court complex. The girl had ridden her bicycle, and said she saw a male riding his bicycle behind her. She and her brother stopped at the park, and the male approached the two children. The male asked the two children if they could help in finding the male's granddaughter.

The brother turned his head to look for the male's granddaughter. At that time the male, who was standing near the 7-year-old girl, pulled up his shorts and exposed himself to her.

No physical contact occurred between the suspect and the girl.

The male was described as elderly, and the two children thought he could be over 70-years-old. He was described as white, was wearing a gray short-sleeved shirt, blue shorts, and a red and blue ball cap. He reportedly has grayish hair, and had several days of stubble growth of facial hair.

At about 4:30 p.m. on 7-21-09, UCPD officers were called by a parent of a second 7-year-old girl who also had been approached by male who exposed himself. Officers responded and learned that the indecent exposure to this victim occurred in the same timeframe as the first-reported incident, and in the same vicinity.

No physical contact occurred in the second reported incident, either.

The suspect description provided by the second victim is a white male with white hair, wearing a light colored shirt, blue shorts, and black tennis shoes.

Officers also spoke with other potential witnesses, who described the suspect's bicycle as being black, perhaps with a black rack attached to the rear. The bicycle may have gray and blue trim, and was described as a mountain-bike style of bicycle.

Police are continuing their investigation. Anyone with information is asked to call UCPD detectives at (303) 492-8168. In the event this subject is seen, police ask that citizens call 9-1-1 to report his location.
