Sep. 6. – Colorado State Recap:

Information above is a very preliminary accounting of police activity at the CU-CSU game. Formalized statistics should be available on Tuesday or Wednesday, and updating of this information will occur at that time.

“This game reflected the fact that we had a near-capacity crowd at the Stadium. We had a higher number of arrests and summonses issued than typical for a football game,” said Commander Tim McGraw. “Additionally,

we had over a dozen transports for medical care, along with several responses by medical personnel to assist people in need attending the game.”

Sep. 19. – Wyoming:

A dramatic reduction in police actions occurred at the CU-Wyoming football game. The number of ejections, and alcohol-related ejections, were virtually half of those encountered at the first home game. “Virtually all the fans really seemed to be into the game, and despite a large crowd, we had fewer issues than we might have anticipated,” said Commander Tim McGraw of the University of Colorado Police Department.
