Information about the class:

1. The class is a three-credit hour course, and student grades in the course will be based on work in the class (rather than at the internship).
2. Students are required to secure an internship- there are many opportunities available in local, state and national government, interest groups and non-profit organizations, campaigns, and other opportunities. Career services has many opportunities listed, and Dr. Donovan also has internship information to share.
3. The class will meet as a group three times during the semester. These meetings will be on Wednesday afternoons from 4-5 during weeks 3, 7 and 14 of the semester.
4. Each student will meet individually with Dr. Donovan at least three times during the semester. These meetings will be scheduled with students at mutually agreeable times.
5. Every week, students will submit an internship journal on D2L. Required online discussions will be scheduled for the weeks that we do not have class or individual meetings. The first online discussion will be a "meet and greet" discussion the first week of class.
6. The class meetings, individual meetings, and online discussions, and course readings will all be aimed at assisting students in writing the required 12-15 page internship paper, which is due on the last day of the semester. Additional assignments in the course will also be aimed at this objective.
7. Students must complete a minimum of 144 hours at the internship to receive credit. This works out to approximately 10 hours per week over a 15 week semester.
