

Fall Semester 2006 Registration/Academic Calendar (Archived 9/19/06)

NOTE: Any student who completes registration agrees to pay the University of Colorado at Boulder all charges on their account when due. (See the bursar's [tuition and fee information](#))

March 20-30 (Mon.-Thurs.)	Fall 2006 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See Course Reservation)
April 3-30 (Mon.-Sun.)	Fall 2006 registration time assignments for students enrolled during spring 2006. For best course selection, register as soon as possible after your time assignment begins. Continuing students can register through June 2 (and also August 7-18).
May 1 (Mon.) - June 2 (Fri.)	<p>Schedule adjustment for continuing degree students who have registered for fall semester and registration for continuing students who have not yet registered. AFTER June 2, continuing students may NOT register or adjust their schedules UNTIL August 7-18.</p> <p>Fall 2006 registration for eligible new graduate students and readmitted students who have confirmed with admissions and eligible students continuing from summer to fall. After June 2, readmitted students may not register or adjust their schedules until August 7-18.</p>
June 5 (Mon.) - August 4 (Fri.)	<p>Fall 2006 registration for incoming freshman and transfer students (on specified dates). Continuing students and readmitted undergraduate students may not register or adjust their schedules until August 7-18.</p> <p>Registration continues (on specified dates) for new graduate students and eligible students continuing from summer to fall.</p>
August 4 (Fri.)	Deadline to update your billing and permanent addresses to ensure that your fall 2006 bill is mailed to the correct address.
August 7-18 (Mon.-Fri.)	<p>Final registration and schedule adjustment for continuing students, new admitted graduate students and readmitted students who have confirmed, as well as eligible students continuing from summer to fall.</p> <p>Final registration period for all incoming freshman and transfer students who have not previously registered (except those in arts and sciences attending the final</p>

	orientation in August) and schedule adjustment for all transfers students who registered in June, July, or early August.
August 7-21 (Mon.-Mon.)	Bills mailed to the billing addresses of all students who register by August 18 (mailed on Mondays to all students who registered by the previous Friday). If no billing address is on record, bills are mailed to the permanent address. (Due on September 6.)
August 18 (Fri.)	<p>Deadline for all students to register for fall courses (except incoming freshmen and transfers in arts and sciences attending the final orientation and any other incoming freshman or transfer student not yet registered). Registration must be completed by midnight on this day to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester. After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a \$50 late fee is charged. (See Late Registration)</p> <p>Deadline (midnight) for continuing students to withdraw from the university and receive a full refund of the \$200 enrollment deposit, less any outstanding charges. (This deadline to withdraw and not forfeit the deposit also applies to students planning to go on the Time Out Program.) New and readmitted students are not eligible for a refund. (See Withdrawal)</p>
August 21-22 (Mon.-Tues.)	Registration for incoming transfer students in arts and sciences who are attending the final transfer orientation on August 21-22. All other eligible incoming transfers who have not yet registered can register via the Web on Tuesday, August 22, 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.
August 24 (Thurs.)	Registration for incoming freshman students in arts and sciences who are attending the final freshman orientation on August 22-24 as well as registration for all other eligible incoming freshmen and transfers who have not yet registered. These students must complete registration by 8:00 p.m. on this day to be guaranteed enrollment for fall semester. After this date, registration is on a space-available basis, and a \$50 late fee is charged. (See Late Registration)
August 25 (Fri.)	<p>Drop/add time assignments begin for all incoming freshman and transfer students. (See Drop/Add)</p> <p>ACCESS registration begins. (See ACCESS)</p>

	Bills mailed to the billing addresses all students who register August 19-24. If no billing address is on record, bills are mailed to the mailing address.
August 27 (Sun.)	Drop/add time assignments begin for all other students. (See Drop/Add) Faculty/staff registration begins.
August 28 (Mon.)	Classes begin.
September 4 (Mon.)	Labor Day holiday. No classes. University closed.
September 5-6 (Tues.-Wed.)	Space-available registration for Senior Citizens Auditors Program, Koenig Alumni Center, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.; continues on Wednesday, September 6, 9:00 a.m. to noon. (See Other Types of Registration)
September 6 (Wed.)	<p>Add Deadline:</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add a course, including independent study and thesis, without the instructor's signature. After this date, the instructor's signature is required on a special action form to add a course (through September 15). NOTE: After 5:00 p.m. on this date, web registration is only available for dropping courses (through 5:00 p.m. on September 13, the drop deadline). (See Drop/Add)</p> <p>Wait List Deadline:</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add name to a course wait list. (See Wait Lists)</p> <p>Tuition and Fees Payment Deadlines:</p> <p>Deadline to pay full tuition and fees (or first payment of two-payment plan). Due before 5:30 p.m. if paid in person or mailed, or before midnight using the internet payment option. No grace period. (See the bursar billing channel on CUConnect under the financial tab or Tuition and Fees)</p> <p>Deadline to sign up for the two-payment plan before midnight via CUConnect. No grace period.</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to select or waive university</p>

	<p>sponsored health insurance at Wardenburg Health Center or by midnight on CUConnect.</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) for private scholarship checks to be received in the financial aid Scholarship Office to avoid late and service charges.</p>
<p>September 13 (Wed.)</p>	<p>Drop Deadline:</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without the instructor's signature, without being assessed tuition and fees for that course, and without a W grade appearing on the transcript. After this date, the instructor's signature is required on a special action form and students must be passing the course to drop it. (See Drop/Add) No refunds for tuition or fees are given for courses dropped after this date.</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to petition to waive UCSU student fees.</p> <p>Deadline to request a refund of any student opportunities fees you selected. (See Student Opportunities Fees)</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and only be assessed a \$200 withdrawal processing fee. After this date, 100 percent of tuition and fees is due for student who withdraw unless there are extenuating circumstances. (See Withdrawal)</p>
<p>September 15 (Fri.)</p>	<p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to add a course without petitioning your dean. NOTE: Instructors' signature is required on a special action form to add a course. In general, instructors only approve an add if students have been regularly attending and there's space in the course. (See Drop/Add) (Note: September 15 is also the deadline for undergraduate resident students to add a course and be eligible for the COF voucher for that course. See COF.)</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to change variable-credit hours, pass/fail, and no-credit status on courses without petitioning your dean. After the deadline, petitions will only be accepted if there are extenuating circumstances. (See Credit and Grading Options)</p>
<p>September 27 (Wed.)</p>	<p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and be eligible to petition to be assessed 40 percent of full tuition</p>

	and fees (instead of being assessed 100 percent of full tuition and fees). (See Withdrawal)
October 6 (Fri.)	Deadline for students who have three or more final exams on the same day for fall semester to make arrangements to change their final exam schedule. (See Calendars and Schedules)
October 11 (Wed.)	<p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to drop a course without petitioning the dean's office. (See Drop/Add)</p> <p>Deadline to pay unpaid balance (including two-payment plan). Due 5:00 p.m. if paid in person or mailed, or before midnight using the internet payment option. No grace period. (See bursar channel under the financial tab in CUConnect or Tuition and Fees)</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to turn in application(s) for the Course Repetition program for fall semester. (See Course Repetition)</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to withdraw from the university and be eligible to petition to be assessed 60 percent of full tuition and fees (instead of being assessed 100 percent of full tuition and fees). (See Withdrawal)</p> <p>Deadline (5:00 p.m.) to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office and be assured a continuing student registration time assignment for spring semester 2006. (See Time Out Program)</p>
October 18 (Wed.)	Spring 2007 course listings available on the Web (tentative date).
October 30 (Mon.) - November 3 (Fri.)	Spring 2007 course reservation registration period for eligible students. (See Course Reservation)
November 6 (Mon.) - December 3 (Sun.)	Spring 2007 registration period for continuing degree students enrolled during fall 2006.
November 20-22 (Mon.-Wed.)	Fall Break. No classes. University remains open.
November 23-24 (Thurs.-Fri.)	Thanksgiving holiday. No classes. University closed.
December 4 (Mon.)	Spring 2007 registration begins for eligible new and readmitted students.

December 15 (Fri.)	<p>Last day of classes for fall 2006.</p> <p>Last day for students to withdraw from the university for fall semester. Students in the colleges/schools of Architecture, Education, Engineering, Journalism, Law, MBA and Music must have their dean's permission to withdraw. (See Withdrawal)</p> <p>Last day for students to turn in Time Out Program (TOP) applications to the registrar's office for fall semester. (See Time Out Program)</p>
December 16-21 (Sat.-Thurs.)	Final exams for fall 2006. (There are no exams on Sunday, December 17.) (See Calendars and Schedules)
December 21 (Thurs.)	Last day to dispute tuition and fee charges for fall withdrawals. (See Tuition Dispute)
December 22 (Fri.)	Fall 2006 commencement, Coors Events/Conference Center, 9:30 a.m.
January 15 (Mon.)	Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. No classes. University closed.
January 16 (Tues.)	Spring 2007 classes begin.
January 24 (Wed.)	Spring 2007 tuition and fee payment due date.
March 26-30 (Mon.-Fri.)	Spring break. No classes. University closed on Friday.
May 4 (Fri.)	Last day of classes for spring 2007.
May 5-10 (Sat.-Thurs.)	Final exams for spring 2007. (There are no exams on Sunday, May 6.)
May 11 (Fri.)	Spring 2007 commencement, Folsom Stadium, 8:30 a.m.
