Counseling & Psychological Services invites applications for a one-year, full-time Post - Doctoral Psychology Fellowship position. This post-doctoral position is located in Counseling & Psychological Services which serves the entire student population. This is a position for a doctoral psychology graduate who is seeking licensure and who is interested in combining individual, couples and group short-term, clinical work with outreach, consultation and supervision activities. Job Responsibilities: The post-doctoral fellow provides individual, couples and group psychotherapy, intake evaluation, triage and disposition of clients, case management, crisis intervention and outreach services to university students. The fellow provides case consultation to faculty, staff and other students regarding students in emotional distress. For 8 hours per week the fellow will serve as a counselor in a university residence hall complex. Presentations and workshops are given on mental health, diversity, and psychological wellness topics to campus groups and classes. Career testing with group or individual interpretation; substance abuse or eating disorder evaluation and/or treatment may be performed depending on skill level and interest. Organization consultation and/or services to student, faculty and staff groups may be elected. This position receives supervision for licensure and may provide supervision to other graduate trainees or undergraduate peer counselors. Time for licensure preparation study is also provided in addition to regular professional development. This is a full-time, one year position with occasional evening work required.

Required Qualifications:

Completed doctorate in clinical, counseling or educational psychology by start date OR an official letter from the applicant's university doctoral program indicating all requirements for doctorate are completed including coursework, internship and dissertation. One year supervised internship experience delivering individual, couples and/or group brief psychotherapy including crisis intervention and clinical case management.

Preferred Qualifications & Required Competencies:

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APA approved doctoral program and internship
One year experience in one or more of the following areas: providing clinical services to a diverse population, designing and delivering programming to students in residence halls, providing individual case consultation, presenting on mental health issues to groups, diagnosing, treating and delivering services to a college student population.

Required Competencies:

Ability to work clinically with diverse populations
Ability to work clinically with college student population
Strong oral and written communication skills
Excellent interpersonal skills
Ability to work collaboratively with other CAPS and campus members
Satisfactory criminal background check

Salary and Benefits: \$30,000. Plus benefits.

When applying applicants must include:

- 1) A letter of application which specifically addresses the post doc requirements and outlines the candidate's required and preferred qualifications
- 2) A current resume
- 3) 3 Letters of reference with at least one from a clinical supervisor from pre-doctoral internship
- 4) Graduate transcripts (Unofficial transcripts are acceptable with the initial application. Official transcripts are required for the final candidate)
- 5) Goals and interests for the fellowship year
