

UPCOMING SOLAR ECLIPSE

The last total solar eclipse to be seen in the continental US was back in 1979. It will once again grace the continental US this month on August 21st. The narrow band of total solar eclipse runs from Oregon to Georgia, however, a partial solar eclipse will be able to be seen by the entire continental US. While many are planning to travel to the path of totality, a partial eclipse will be visible in Boulder, CO. If you are not planning to travel, but rather you wish to stay in Boulder, you will still have an amazing sight to see.

In order to check out this event, there are various ways to see the eclipse. Eclipse glasses are available for sale at Fiske Planetarium, McGuckin Hardware, and the CU Bookstore - get them early! If you do not have eclipse glasses, you can make a pinhole camera. You can also watch NASA live video from the total eclipse here.

Make sure you don't miss this incredible opportunity to see a solar eclipse!
