Credit not granted for this course and PORT 2150. Meets MAPS requirement for foreign language. PREREQ PORT 1020 OR 1150 (MIN GRADE C-) OR PLACEMENT. CREDIT NOT GRANTED FOR THIS COURSE & PORT 2150.
