- III. NAGPS Conference- Kate Allison-EDUC
 - a. National Association of Graduate professional Students conference
 - i. Officers presented on a survey conducted between school of Mines and CSU
 - ii. Presentation on Open Access to engage with other grad students who are working on Open Access initiatives
 - 1. Stanford is working on Open Access initiatives on graduate student specific policies
- IV. CUPD Update- Ty, Sarah
 - a. The response was against the law- Jean Cleary Act
 - i. Jean Cleary law enacted as she was raped and murdered I her dorm room
 - ii. Every University must accurately and timely report any crime that occurs on campus within two business days
 - 1. Notification is only necessary if there was an on-going threat
 - 2. CU is being investigated by the federal government for not being in compliance with Cleary

- iii. Kelsey- ENVS- An incident that occurred with harassment and indecent exposure and the officer who she reported crime to was told that no crime had been committed
 - 1. An information report was filed, a report used to construct patterns
 - 2. Phone calls were recorded and if requested can be released publicly
- iv. CUPD expressed deep regret during conversation today
 - 1. Will be reclassified whether it was a crime or not after looking at the report over again
- v. Two actionable ideas- can file a claim for the violation of the Cleary Act, or to reach out to the Student Code of Conduct board
 - 1. There is only once person who deals with all violations of code, so there is no follow up on the reporting of these crimes
 - 2. Ben-PSCI- The school or the police are under investigation?
 - a. The federal government provides funding to the school, and if they violate Title nine the school must negotiate with the government or funding will be relinquished
 - i. They can contact OCR- Office of Civil Rights
 - Also a Title nine liaison who resides under ODH, Office of Discrimination and Harassment
 - iii. Also reach out to Boulder PD
 - 3. Laura-AERO- Is there any potential to get rid of CU Police?
 - a. If something happens on campus it is a CUPD office, if something happens in a dorm during a football game, Boulder police can step in
- vi. Kelsey-ENVS- Asked to return to the police to understand the overall graduate student experience with reporting harassment or inadequate sanctioning
- vii. Emily-GERM- Anyone who has experience any sexual assault/any crime should directly report to the Boulder police?
 - 1. There has been a trend that the police could do a lot more
 - 2. Student Code of Conduct does not need DNA, blood, or lab related evidence, the police are above 99% proof, the University doesn't find them guilty of a crime, but of a violation of the student code of conduct
 - 3. Office of Victims assistance helps sort out the best option for victims, completely confidential
 - a. CUPD doesn't tell you that resource is available
