Serves as a member of the library's executive leadership team comprised of the Dean/University Librarian (UL) and other AULs of the University of Michigan (U-M) Library, one of the largest academic research libraries in the U.S. with the annual budget of +\$83 million, +15 million physical and digital volumes, +425 FTE library faculty and staff, and 10 branch libraries in 4 library buildings and 14 off-site facilities (780,000 sq ft in total). Participates in the executive leadership team's strategic planning and execution of a collaborative and forward-looking vision and critical goals for the U-M Library, ongoing central resource planning (financial/ personnel/ space), and donor-engagement activities and fund-raising campaign work coordinated by the library's Development Office with the current goal of \$30 million ([U-M goal](#): \$7 billion).

Oversees the library's Information Technology (LIT) Division and Collections Division, providing a vision, strategic and operational leadership, and guidance for key partnership efforts on campus and beyond. The LIT division's portfolio includes managing +236 digital collections, +350TB of digital content (30TB of which are research data sets), 5 digital repository platforms, +75 software applications/systems, the IT infrastructure and facilities (+50 physical servers; +220 virtual machines; +550 PCs and other IT equipment throughout the library building; and +25 technology-enhanced meeting rooms). The Collections division develops and stewards the U-M

Library's +15 million-volume collection through acquisition and licensing, e-resource management, technical services and metadata management, collection development, gift-processing, and scholarly communication.

Manages +100 FTE personnel (in the LIT and the Collections Division) with close attention to cultivating inclusive organizational culture, building buy-in for shared goals, priorities, and values through open dialogues, fostering synergistic teamwork, and focusing on talent recruitment/retention. Balances the annual budget of +\$44 million (for LIT and Collections) with a view to fiscal responsibility, effectiveness, and sustainability and seeks, obtains, and cultivates internal/external funding (including philanthropic gifts) necessary for innovation and continued operational excellence.

Maintains effective partnerships with all campus units ranging from the U-M Office of the VP for Research, the U-M Office of the VP for Student Life, and the U-M Disability and Equity Office, to the U-M Office of VPIT-CIO (ITS) to surface and address the issues and challenges that benefit from coordination and joint actions. Actively communicates and collaborates with other campus units that collect and steward cultural collections, such as [Bentley Historical Library](#) and [William L. Clements Library](#), towards the goal of the effective and collaborative management and long-term preservation of all cultural collections and content at the university through [the U-M Cultural Collections Council](#). Works closely with [U-M Press/Michigan Publishing](#), the library's Copyright Office, and the [U-M Office of the VP and General Council](#), in order to advance open access, open education, and open scholarship. Lead many consortial and other external partnership initiatives with well-known entities such as [Academic Preservation Trust](#), [Big Ten Academic Alliance](#) (BTAA), [Google Books/HathiTrust](#), [HELIOS Open](#) to maximize at scale the impact of the library's work in open access, copyright/fair-use/e-resources licensing, digital collections and preservation, IT infrastructure, AI (artificial intelligence) and ML (machine learning), and digital accessibility.

Significant Contributions

- Played a key role in recent development of the U-M Library's new strategic framework released in Fall 2025, bringing together diverse viewpoints and perspectives through open dialogues, especially in the area of "ethical adoption of technology."
- Set the key strategic goals for the LIT Division in alignment with the U-M Library's strategic directions and objectives through multiple leadership retreats, faculty/staff/stakeholder group buy-in, and inclusive change management processes, executed the action plan with milestones to be accomplished in a three-to-five-year timeframe, and delivered successful outcomes in all three areas of strategic goal areas.
- Developed a set of norms for LIT work and socialized it across the division for more effective team work: (i) stay open, flexible, and receptive to changes; (ii) draw from one another's diverse and distinct perspectives, knowledge, and skills to build our strengths and create our successes; (iii) plan small, act with speed and priority, and complete and iterate frequently to realize our ambitious goals; (iv) learn and experiment on an ongoing basis to improve, innovate, and excel; (v) collaborate and communicate with respect, curiosity, and thoughtfulness; and (vi) ground our work on the equal and strong partnership of a technology team, a service team, and a stakeholders group(s).
- Launched a more flexible and reliable digital preservation solution that provides the automated content-ingest/processing/deposit workflows for all five digital repository platforms, meets the long-term preservation standards, and realizes significant ongoing cost-savings in data storage cost by (i) assessing and re-envisioning of the library's digital preservation solution used by multiple campus partners (as [Bentley Historical Library](#) and [William L. Clements Library](#), [U-M Press/Michigan Publishing](#), and [LSA Museums](#)), (ii) obtaining the necessary funding, and (iii) successfully executing the project.
- Contributed to the development and discussion of [the U-M-wide policy/guidelines for research data stewardship](#) and raised the awareness of library services related to scholarly communication (open access/ open science/ open publishing/ open scholarship/ open infrastructure) through the U-M college-

CIOs group (STAC-Core) and prompted an institution-level review of the digital storage cost concerns in collaboration with the Office of the Vice President for Research and the Office of the VPIT-CIO.

- Successfully obtained \$600,000 budget increase (ongoing) to rebuild the library's new digital object repository platform to meet the pressing needs of the entire U-M scholarly/research community by developing a special funding request - "Digital repository infrastructure" - to the Provost's Office for FY24 and FY25, creating 5 new base positions.
- Successfully established an endowment fund for the Student Cataloguer fellowship for the library's Technical Services and pursued and secured multiple donor gifts to create the UX Fellowship program and the Digital Collections Metadata Remediation program as the outcome of the effective fund-raising work.
- Participated in the space planning and renovation of Shapiro Undergraduate Library's 3rd floor into [Stephen S. Clark Commons](#) (37,500 sqft) funded by the \$6 million-donor gift and designed through extensive student/faculty/staff engagement and collaboration.
- Increased the library's AI (artificial intelligence) readiness by organizing the library-wide discussion of [the U-M Generative AI report](#) upon release (Summer 2023); created a library-wide community of AI practice; and planned for and led the AULs' group through a dozen in-depth discussion sessions on AI for the U-M Library for several months and produced the successful outcomes, which consist of: (i) a guideline document - "The U-M Library's Approach to Artificial Intelligence (AI)" - which addresses and clarifies many of the concerns commonly raised when AI is discussed in the library context for it to serve as a stepping-stone in moving the library faculty/staff towards more active, flexible, and open-minded engagement with AI (released to the library staff in Dec. 2024) and (ii) a funding proposal for the library's formal adoption and integration of AI into the library work, "GenAI Readiness for the Library" (\$441,000), which was submitted as a special budget request to the Provost's Office for FY26.
- Participated in multiple university-level visioning and planning committees on AI in the context of U-M as a large academic research enterprise and the work of developing the recommendations for the new AI Institute at U-M with its governance structure, resources, and strategic research/outreach themes for the U-M Office of the Provost and the U-M Office of the Vice President for Research.
- Significantly improved the completion rate of IT projects and staff morale (in software development in particular) by fully establishing a new IT project planning and management process and a new set of tools, which emphasize thoughtful prioritization, realistic resourcing, lightweight processes, and the timely review and revision of project plans.
- To respond to the strong demand by the LIT staff to pursue one of the library's strategic goals (2019-2025), sponsored multiple division-wide year-round initiatives in equity and inclusion for both the LIT Division (2022-2024) and the Collections Division (2024-2025).
- Sponsored the Subject Heading remapping and the Subject Browse project for [U-M Library Search](#), which addressed the issue of harmful and outdated languages in the library's metadata, to successful completion and guided the library's Digital Accessibility Team to re-envision the digital accessibility work in light of the new federal regulation change (ADA Title II).
- Improved the staffing and retention for both the LIT and the Collections Division by (i) obtaining successful salary equity reviews/increases for +30 current library faculty/staff members (2022 - Present), (ii) creating jointly funded positions with other campus units in appropriate areas, and (iii) making changes in the shared staffing with [HathiTrust](#) to achieve satisfactory outcomes for both parties.
- Reduced LIT's office space footprint on both the 3rd and the 4th floor of the Hatcher Graduate Library based upon the increased remote work pattern during the pandemic and freed up +40% of the space so that it can be used by the library staff (in the Collections Division) who work primarily on site, thereby significantly improving the on-site staff's daily workspace conditions.

2017 – 2022 **Chief Technology Officer / Full Professor (Tenured)**, University of Rhode Island (URI) – University Libraries, Kingston, RI.

Served as a member of the URI Libraries' Leadership Team led by the Dean and provided strategic leadership and vision for the library's Scholarly Technology team. Managed all digital programs and technology solutions, projects, budget (+\$800k per year excluding salaries), personnel (\pm 10-15 FTEs equivalent including middle managers, PTEs, and student workers), technology-enhanced learning spaces throughout the library building, and the entire IT operation at an academic research library structured as an academic college. Added, improved, and refreshed the technology offerings and the infrastructure in close collaboration with the university IT and all library units.

Successfully proposed, planned, implemented, and evaluated innovative teaching/learning/research-related initiatives ranging from an AI (Artificial Intelligence) Lab, a makerspace, a data science consulting center, and an interactive digital data-wall to a virtual reality (VR) lab for immersive and interactive learning in collaboration with the university's teaching faculty and colleagues at the URI Libraries. Obtained resources and funding for emerging technologies and digital initiatives to advance the learning, teaching, and research activities on campus and beyond.

Significant Contributions

- Planned and launched [the AI Lab](#) equipped with a GPU server and multiple machine learning-optimized desktops to support research, teaching, and learning activities on campus, the first of its kind developed and housed in an academic research library.
- Created and fully established [the Rhode Island AI Meetup](#), which brought AI researchers in academia, business/industry, and corporate research centers in Rhode Island together to URI for collaboration.
- Successfully transformed [the MakerspaceURI](#) from its pilot phase to the fully-featured routine library operation by adding new personnel, equipment, educational programs/ workshop series, services, policies, monthly newsletters, and social media outreach and established it as a highly valued learning space across the URI campus.
- Supported the URI Big Data initiative and participated in the URI Data Science Consulting Center planning.
- Developed a new 3-credit undergraduate interdisciplinary course (General Education/[Grand Challenge](#)), *LTI 450G: Technology and Power*, which focuses on digital technologies -such as Big Data, Internet of Things, digital surveillance, machine learning, and AI- and their social impact and ethical implications.
- During the Covid-19 pandemic:
 - Led the investigation and the subsequent implementation of new library-wide services and systems to help the URI students and faculty meet the new challenges in learning, teaching, and research – e.g. adding more laptops and tablets for check-out (in a drastically increased volume), wi-fi hotspots, Lean Library browser add-on, Third Iron Complete, and online appointment solutions.
 - Adjusted the meeting and communication practices of the scholarly technology team to best accommodate the changes in work tasks and environments during the pandemic.
 - Planned and implemented the full IT support for the new remote work environment from home for the library faculty and staff.
 - Re-organized and adjusted existing services and programs of the makerspace by introducing the order-and-pick-up digital fabrication service and a series of follow-along video tutorials.
 - Set up a remote-access solution (Apache Guacamole) for the high-performance PCs at the AI Lab and the makerspace.

2014 – 2017 **Associate Director for Library Applications and Knowledge Systems**, University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) - Health Sciences and Human Services Library (HS/HSL), Baltimore, MD.

Served as a member of the library's executive leadership team with four other ADs, leading one of the largest academic health sciences libraries in the U.S. Led the library's newly formed technology division - CATS (Computing and Technology Services) - in the founding Associate Director (AD) role. Oversaw the personnel (+8 FTEs) and the budget (+\$800k per year excluding salaries). Managed all library technology solutions and digital projects, application development & web services, emerging/instructional technologies initiatives, technology-enhanced learning spaces, and IT operations and infrastructure, which includes +25 virtual machines, 7 physical servers, +35 applications, +250 PCs and other IT equipment throughout the library building including +20 technology-enhanced meeting rooms and study rooms, 3 computer classrooms, 1 makerspace, and 1 Presentation Practice Studio. Participated in the library administration's fund-raising efforts and engaged with donors on behalf of the library on a regular basis. Successfully led and completed numerous projects in technology, learning/teaching, system implementation, application development, and technology infrastructure in close collaboration with other library divisions and the university IT.

Significant Contributions

- Participated in the creation of the HS/HSL Strategic Plan 2015-2020 as a member of the HS/HSL executive leadership team through multiple listening tours around the campus and brought it in close alignment with the university's priorities; Developed the CATS division strategic plan 2015-2020 through extensive staff engagement and participation.
- Built a stronger, more responsive, more user-focused, and more collaborative technology division and successfully added two positions (Senior Web Developer and Emerging Technologies Librarian) to increase the capacity for inter-divisional collaboration and new digital programs.
- Established user experience and user-centered design as a key strategic direction for the newly formed CATS division and enriched and expanded library services by applying the technology staff's expertise and skills to the broader library operation.
- Proposed and implemented [the new HS/HSL Innovation Space](#) (=makerspace) including the staff training, the staff workflow, the front-end and the back-end application for the new services (3D printing and large poster printing), new workshops and classroom instruction, and other educational outreach offerings.
- Expanded, renovated, and re-launched the makerspace and added a new VR room.
- Led the planning and organization of the campus-wide conference, "[Cybersecurity and You: Issues in Higher Education and Beyond](#)" jointly with the university IT and the UMB Law library.
- Encouraged and supported proof-of-concept applications and experiments.
