

Major Requirements-Department of Anthropology
University of Colorado, Boulder

These major requirements are effective for students declaring a major in Anthropology during the Fall of 2017 and thereafter.

Anthropology majors must fulfill all requirements for graduation set forth by the College of Arts and Sciences. A maximum of 45 hours in Anthropology may be used to meet degree requirements of the College.

Majors must complete a minimum of 30 semester hours of Anthropology courses, with a grade of **C- or better**, and at least 18 of these hours must be at the upper-division level. The cumulative GPA in Anthropology must be at least 2.0. All **required courses** for the major must be completed with a grade of **C- or better**, and none of the required courses in the major may be taken for a Pass/Fail grade. Twelve hours of upper-division work in the major must be completed on the Boulder campus.

The following ANTH courses are required for Anthropology majors:

1. **ANTH 2010** Introduction to Biological Anthropology
2. **ANTH 2100** Introduction to Cultural Anthropology
3. **ANTH 2200** The Archaeology of Human History
4. One upper-division course in **Cultural Anthropology**
5. One upper-division course in **Archaeology**
6. One upper-division course in **Biological Anthropology**
7. Twelve hours of electives in Anthropology, nine must be at the upper-division level.

In addition, students planning to pursue writing a senior honor's thesis or graduate work in Anthropology are advised to take ANTH 4000 (Quantitative Methods).
