Access CU Architecture

For 100 years, the Hellems Arts and Sciences building has stood at both the physical and intellectual center of the University of Colorado Boulder. The historic building welcomes 56% of all first-year students, and 85% of CU undergraduates take at least one class there by the time they graduate. Today, Hellems requires health, safety, and accessibility improvements to maximize inclusion and foster student success. The redesign of Hellems will provide an enhanced student experience, a home for Arts & Sciences majors to gather, and a space for students from all parts of the university to engage in interdisciplinary education, and collaborate with one another.

In 1921, the doors of Hellems opened to approximately 2,100 enrolled students and today, 100 years later, Hellems remains one of the most used buildings on campus with a student body that is 15 times larger.

Hellems was named after beloved CU Liberal Arts Latin Professor and Dean, Fred Burton Reiny Hellems. Experiencing a class in Hellems is one of the most commonly held experiences of CU Boulder students and alumni.

CAAAS (Center for African & African American Studies): CAAAS, founded in 2021, is the only African & African American research institution in the entire Rocky Mountain region! It is the only designated black space focused on the black experience! The mission is to research, promote, preserve, interpret, and disseminate knowledge about the histories, cultures, and arts of Africa, African Americans, and the wider world of the African diaspora.

CNAIS (Center for Native American and Indigenous Studies)

CNAIS provides Native students and faculty an intellectual and social home at CU Boulder. The center promotes collaborative research focusing on both local and global Indigenous knowledge and fosters wide ranging CNAIS projects that aim to open conversations both in Colorado and the world.

MASP (Miramontes Arts & Sciences Program)

MASP is an inclusive academic community in the College of Arts & Sciences comprised of motivated students dedicated to

pursuing academic excellence at CU Boulder. MASP supports traditionally underrepresented and/or first-generation college students who want to be part of a diverse, multicultural academic enrichment community. MASP is a cooperative and collaborative program that offers a participation scholarship and dedicated space for activities, advising, studying, and seminars.

The Heritage Center celebrates the extraordinary history of the University of Colorado Boulder Campus by preserving its legacy with a broad collection of artifacts and memorabilia. Popular exhibits provide a captivating journey from the past to the present and highlight the contributions of notable alumni.

There's so much to see at the Heritage Center!

When you visit the LEGO model of the CU Boulder campus made up of 1,000,000 LEGO bricks, observe all the details of campus. It's a work of art. You don't have to count each LEGO to verify that!



Then head over to see The Glenn Miller Orchestra memorabilia collection, which includes the first gold record ever awarded.



The Space Room houses CU alumni astronaut memorabilia including gloves worn by Jack Swigert of Apollo 13.

Access Languages

Anderson Language and Technology Center (ALTEC) broadens and deepens cultural understanding through innovative approaches to language learning and teaching. ALTEC does this by offering remote non-credit online language classes for adults worldwide and at a discounted rate for CU System faculty, staff, and current students.

Join an intimate, like-minded cohort of learners in 8-10 week classes starting in September, January, and July in American Sign Language, Arabic, Italian, German, Mandarin, Japanese, or Spanish. Additional languages are added regularly. Not sure which language you want to take? No problem! Consider ALTEC's FREE Foundations course to learn the basics in seven languages through Canvas. Online on your time!

ALTEC is located on the first floor of Hellems Hall and features The HIVE, a study, meeting, collaboration, and event space that overlooks the quad and houses language resources and VR tools, in addition to MAC and PC classrooms.

Access Astronomy & Astrophysics

Fiske Planetarium offers a wide-range of diverse and engaging experiences including live and recorded talks, laser and liquid sky music shows, concerts, films, and special celestial events throughout the year. Innovative, immersive, and ever-changing events make Fiske Planetarium a world-class experience for everybody.

Did you know there are 10 million stars in the dome?



Fiske has been sharing the skies and some pretty epic music shows since 1975! The 65-foot diameter dome is the largest between Chicago and Los

Angeles. While there, you can explore liquid sky and laser shows set to favorite music and experience walking on the sun's surface surrounded by coronal loops and solar flares.

Access Art

The University of Colorado Art Museum provides a forum for exchanging ideas, inspiring collaboration and fueling imagination through art.

The CU Art Museum is the only museum in Boulder area and in the University of Colorado-system devoted solely to the collecting and preserving artwork from across time and culture. Originally under the direction and care of the University of Colorado Department of Fine Arts (now the Department of Art and Art History), the institution and its collection were founded in 1940 with a belief in the unique power of object-based teaching to inspire and educate students.

Enjoy the art, learn about different cultures and perspectives and ways of making art.

Park in Euclid Parking Garage. Walk less than one block north to the CU Art Museum, located in the Visual Arts Complex. There is a large plaza in front of the south-facing museum entrance, and the building is to your right and has a large glass entrance lobby. There is no admission fee to the museum so bring a friend along!

The Conference on World Affairs (CWA) is a year-round unit of the University of Colorado Boulder, offering events without admission fees to the Boulder community, students, and the public. The CWA is a premier forum for discussion of world affairs, attracting a diverse group of experts and engaging



panelists from around the world. Our goal is to engage, educate, and inspire University of Colorado students, faculty, and staff, the greater Boulder community, and the people of Colorado and

the nation to exchange ideas, acquire knowledge, and gain new insights.

CWA celebrates its 75th anniverary in 2023. The Conference will be **April 12-14, 2023**. The week features 200 panels, 100 speakers and performers over 5 days, attracting more than 70,000 in cumulative attendance. If you haven't attended it personal or virtually before, make this your year to be there!

CWA is partnering with campus and the United Nations Human Rights to host the *Right Here, Right Now* Global Climate Summit at CU-Boulder in December 2022.

CWA 2023 will continue and expand conversations related to the global climate crisis. CWA wil do what it does best—bring a diverse and eclectic lens to the issues and opportunities. We're already talking about a wide array of topics such as:

- Thin Ice: The Impact of Climate on Winter Sport and Leisure
- National Security and the Threat of Climate Change
- Food For Thought: Healthy Diets for a Healthy Planet
