Tips & Tricks

Would you like to help students learn how to become better writers and resist the urge to copy and paste? Did you know that in D2L, you have an access to Turnitin which checks documents for unoriginal content? **Turnitin** compares submitted papers to other student papers, current and archived webpages, periodicals, journals and other publications. After the comparison has been made, it produces an originality report indicating what percentage of the student's paper matches documents in their database. Turnitin can best be used to help students learn how to improve their academic writing and maintain academic integrity.

Also, Turnitin has a feature called **GradeMark**, which allows you to make comments on student papers, similar to Track Changes in Microsoft Word. [This tutorial](#) demonstrates how to access and use GradeMark from within a Desire2Learn course.

What is it?

Trello is a free and easy to use organizational tool that can help you to manage projects. Trello organizes projects into boards that you can share with others. Within each board you can assign tasks to collaborators, establish deadlines, create checklists, attach documents, share links and images, and comment on the status of a task.

Why use it?

This versatile tool allows you to manage your personal projects, academic collaborations, or your students' work. It's especially convenient for those who work across multiple devices as Trello is available through the web and on iOS, Android, Amazon, and Windows 8 devices.
