- I. <u>Concealed Carry Weapons Ban at CU</u>

CUSG Tri-Exec Chase Cromwell was featured in a recent Daily Camera article regarding a Concealed Carry Weapons Ban at CU. Cromwell updated members on <u>pending state</u> <u>legislation</u> that, if adopted, could impact CU system rules that currently allow for concealed carry weapons on campus. Cromwell also noted that CU was an outlier nationally in this issue. Representatives were asked to inform their colleagues and to ensure campus members are aware of these items.

Members reviewed the proposed policy and resolution that was introduced at December Assembly. The new policy will meet state CDHE guidance on prior learning assessment. The BFA Academic Affairs committee reviewed the policy and did not receive any feedback. Members voted to approve the resolution with 35 in favor; 5 opposed; and 6 abstentions. Academic Affairs, the Registrar and Bursars offices will begin work on business processes for the new policy.
