Job Summary:

We are encouraging applications for a Student Assistant to assist the BioFrontiers Education Programs Manager in day-to-day management of the education programs at BioFrontiers Institute. The period of employment will be October 2024 - May 2025 with the possibility of extension.

Who We Are

The education team at BioFrontiers works on a variety of educational initiatives including undergraduates, graduates and post graduate students.

The Interdisciplinary Quantitative Biology (IQ Biology) Certificate PhD Program is an educational initiative sponsored by the BioFrontiers Institute of the University of Colorado. Started in 2011, this program is supported by an NSF grant. The IQ Biology program seeks to attract talented, diverse and curious students eager to come together from 16 different CU Boulder STEM PhD programs to form a cohort with sufficient biological, computational, and mathematical knowledge to fully assess modern scientific problems. IQ Biology students learn core competences in bioscience and the mathematical/computational sciences as part of an interdisciplinary cohort.

At the University of Colorado BioFrontiers Institute, researchers from the life sciences, physical sciences, computer science, and engineering are working together to uncover new knowledge at the frontiers of science, and partnering with industry to make their discoveries relevant.

What Your Key Responsibilities Will Be

Assists with keeping student information updated including checklists, rosters, and data. Help maintain Excel spreadsheets for data collection, program statistics and record keeping. Support ongoing and new diversity, equity and inclusion efforts. Help with planning recruitment weekend and planning individual appointments with faculty. Search, download, and save graduate school application materials using CU-SIS. Periodically communicate with faculty to gather and collect information regarding current students. Will work with the Education Programs Manager and the Interdisciplinary Quantitative Biology (IQ Biology) Program Director.
