# STUDENT FEES

Students are charged tuition and mandatory student fees. Mandatory student fees are comprised of new student fees, student activity fees, program fees, and course fees as described below.

#### **New Student Fee**

One-time, nonrefundable fee assessed at time of first registration for students entering a degree program. Nondegree students who are admitted to degree status are charged the new student fee at the time they first register. The fee covers registration/transcript type services (\$35), undergraduate orientation program (\$50), Buff OneCard (\$21), immunization management (\$6), international orientation (\$43) and Forever Buffs Alumni Membership (\$70; undergraduates only). Fee varies depending upon degree and international status.

### Student Activity Fees (CUSG-Managed)

Student Activity Fees are approved by vote of elected student representatives. All students are charged the University of Colorado Student Government (CUSG) student activity fees at one of the following rates per semester, according to their enrollment and selection of health insurance:

Base Fees	\$ 62.11
Doctoral Candidate Fees	\$125.76

Payment of full CUSG student fees is mandatory for all students unless enrolled in only one class of five or fewer credit hours in which case base fees are charged. If the student is eligible for base fees and is covered by the Student Health Gold Insurance plan, they must also pay the Wardenburg portion of student fees in the amount of \$63.65. The full CUSG student activity fee may only be waived due to extraordinary circumstances such as a medical condition. Petitions to waive CUSG fees must be received by 5:00 p.m. on September 7, 2011 (for fall), and February 1, 2012 (for spring). No late petitions are accepted. Petitions may be picked up and turned in at the CUSG office in UMC 125, and must include documentation of the reasons for waiving the fees.

#### Student Activity Fees (Fee Advisory Board-Managed)

Charged to Boulder main-campus students per semester according to enrollment.

## Arts and Cultural Enrichment Fee

Supports on-campus performing arts (theatre, dance, music, and fine arts); provides no-charge or reduced cost admission for students to museums, performances, etc.; student supported, mandated by Regents in June 1995.

#### ASSET Fee

# \$1.32 per credit hour

Arts and Sciences Support for Educational Technology , supports development and delivery of instruction in the college of Arts and Sciences; charged to undergraduate and graduate students for Arts and Sciences courses regardless of the student's major (except for any courses in any unit entitled Honors Thesis, Master's Thesis, or Doctoral Thesis, and except any course numbered 6000 or above). Approved by Board of Regents in April 2008.

# Athletic Fee

Charged only to students carrying four or more credit hours; supports quality intercollegiate athletics programs and reduces student ticket prices; mandated by Regents in 1980, current reduced fee mandated in June 1993.

#### Capital Construction Fee

\$200.00

Charged to students taking seven or more credit hours; \$100.00 is charged for students taking six or fewer credit hours; supports five capital construction projects; 20 percent will be allocated to need-based financial aid. Student bill passed in 2004. Began in fall 2006. Fee is implemented on a progressive basis increasing to \$200/student/semester in FY2010.

#### **Career Services Fee**

\$ 9.00 Charged to all Boulder campus degree seeking students except law and D-status grad students; provide students with help deciding on a major, professional career counseling, a resource center, skills presentations, video practice interviews, recommendation files, online listings of internship and career opportunities, internship fairs, etc.; recommended by the Administrative Fee Review Board in April 2001 and approved by the Regents in June 2001.

#### SEVIS International Processing Fee \$ 22.00

Charged to international students; funds mandatory federal compliance reporting approved by Regents in 2003.

#### Student Bus and Bike Programs \$ 78.00

Allows students unlimited use of public transportation (RTD) in Boulder County, Broomfield, Westminster, and Denver including to DIA, Rockies Ride, and Buffs Ride; includes Broncos Ride or other special event rides. Fee supports Night Hop Shuttle connecting Hill Area to downtown Boulder, Day Hop, Stampede, Skip and others. Student initiated and approved by Administration and Regents in 1991.

## Student Computing

\$ 67.24

\$ 7.00

Charged to students taking 7 or more credit hours; \$33.62 charged for 6 or fewer credit hours; used for building, maintaining, expanding, and updating computing labs; provides all students with access to e-mail and the Internet, etc.; supported by students and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and approved by Regents in 1990.

### Student Information System

For maintenance of the three-campus student online computer systems; each campus contributes to its support approved by Administration and Regents in 1984.

#### UGGS United Gov of Grad Students \$ 4.50 Administrative fee for all graduate students only; Board of Regents approved in 2002.
