Student Activity Fee

All students are charged University of Colorado Student Union (UCSU) student activity fees at one of the following rates, according to their enrollment:

Full Fees	\$348.24
Base Fees	\$ 66.78
Base fees plus Wardenburg	\$139.40

UCSU student fees are mandatory for students covered by Golden Buffalo Student Health Insurance plan and/or are enrolled in more than one class or in one class of more than 5 credit hours. They may only be waived due to extraordinary circumstances. If full fees are waived, the base fee of \$66.78 must still be paid. Petitions to **waive UCSU fees** must be received by 5:00 p.m. on **January 21, 2009**. No late petitions are accepted. Petitions may be picked up and turned in at the UCSU office in UMC 125, and must include documentation of the reasons for waiving the fees.

Note: Students covered by Golden Buffalo Student Health Plans are automatically charged full fees but can request to pay base fees plus Wardenburg.
