COLLEGE OPPORTUNITY FUND (COF) \$85 per credit hour/semester

The College Opportunity Fund (COF), created by the Colorado legislature, provides a stipend to eligible undergraduates paying in-state tuition. The stipend pays a portion of total in-state tuition for eligible undergraduate students who attend a Colorado public institution or a participating private institution. The stipend is paid to the institution on a per-credit-hour basis, and the credit-hour amount is set annually by the General Assembly. Students must complete the COF application on the official state College Opportunity Fund website and authorize use of funds to receive COF. Students who do not complete both of these steps will be responsible for paying the total in-state tuition.

The Board of Regents reserves the right to change tuition and fee rates at any time. Tuition charged is based on residency, degree and number of credit hours. Fractional credit hours outside of flat rate tuition are assessed the average rate between the two closest credit hours. Dual degrees are charged the higher rate. These rates apply to Boulder Main Campus only. Rates and guarantee groups may be subject to change.

¹ Total tuition continues to increase at the same increment for each hour over 18.

New undergraduates and undergraduate transfers

A&S (ASSET) Fee \$1.32/per credit hour

Applied to all classes in the College of Arts and Sciences regardless of a student's major or program of study.

COLORADO RESIDENT TUITION GUARANTEE

Guarantees the same tuition and fee rates for four calendar years.

Group L: first enrolled Spring 2017 or earlier

Group M: first enrolled Summer 2017, Fall 2017 or Spring 2018

Group N: first enrolled Summer 2018, Fall 2018, or Spring 2019

Students first enrolled in Summer 2019 pay Group N rates in Summer 2019 and then move to Group O rates (published in July) starting in Fall 2019.
