

Intra-University Transfer to Leeds

Undergraduate students wishing to transfer to the Leeds School of Business from another college or school on the Boulder campus must do so through an Intra-University Transfer (IUT). Applicants are considered for admission on the basis of specified criteria. The school reserves the right to revise the IUT application process or admission criteria when necessary. NOTE: Students who already have an undergraduate degree of any kind will not be admitted to Leeds.

Admissions Criteria

All current CU students who wish to transfer to Leeds or add a degree in business will be accepted if the following criteria are met. <u>Applications will not be accepted if any of the</u> requirements are still in progress.

- 24 semester hours completed, 12 of which must be graded coursework at CU-Boulder.
- A minimum 3.0 <u>CU</u> GPA is required for admission.
- If you have taken any business classes, you must have a business GPA of 2.0 or better.
- Completion of the following 3-4 courses with a grade of B- or better.
- 1. Microeconomics (ECON 2010)
- 2. Macroeconomics (ECON 2020)
- 3. **Introduction to Statistics** (MATH 2510 or equivalent required beginning Fall 2017)
- 4. Mathematical Analysis in Business (MATH 1112) Offered to non-business students. Not transferrable; must be taken at CU. MATH 1112 is required for your Leeds program regardless if you took Calculus. This will be on only math option beginning Fall 2017.

*Note: If you have completed these courses at another institution and the courses have not been previously submitted to CU, a transcript should be attached to your application to confirm that you have earned the minimum grade.

Application Process

- Applications are available online through the link above.
- <u>You must have completed all pre-requisites before</u> <u>applying. Your application will not be considered if you</u> <u>have pre-requisite courses in progress</u>.
- Applications are accepted year-round and will be reviewed once a month. Please check the website for deadlines. It is recommended that students apply prior to the registration period so that they are guaranteed the best course availability October 1st for spring and March 1st for fall. Leeds can't guarantee the usual selection of courses for those who submit applications after the registration period.

Fall registration is closed June-August for continuing students. If you wish to enroll in business courses for fall, you will need to turn in your application before it closes.

Advising and Information Sessions

Information sessions and group advising is available weekly. Follow two steps to obtain an appointment:

Registering for Classes

Prospective students should enroll in any required freshman or sophomore non-business classes (A&S Core or MAPS) that you have not completed.

Non-business students will generally only have access to BCOR classes during summer terms or through Continuing Education and Professional Studies.
