




Background: Growing Inequality

The divide between Colorado's top and bottom is widening

COMPARING COLORADO'S TOP 1% TO THE BOTTOM 99%






In 2004, **13% of Colorado workers** were employed in jobs paying below 100% FPL.

In 2016, the amount of Coloradans working in low-wage jobs was up to 22%.

27% of Coloradans live below the "Self Sufficiency Standard.

Colorado's middle-income families are disappearing





 A Middle Class income range has gone up by roughly \$20,000 per year


The Bell's look at Colorado's middle class

 Two earners are essential to making the income necessary to afford an aspirational middle class budget

 Child Care, higher education, and housing are the primary hurdles families must overcome. Student debt has gone up dramatically for these families.

 Only ¼ of middle income families have children in the home and families are having children later. The Bell's look at Colorado's middle class







Colorado occupations rated by likelihood of entering the middle class and moving upward


