
Transferology Instructions - How to see if a course is pre-approved


Follow these instructions if you have identified a specific course that you want to take at another school, and want to know if it's already approved for transfer to CU Boulder.

In the example below, a student wants to take the course CIVE 313 from Colorado Mesa University, and wants to know if it's approved for transfer to CU Boulder.


1) Go to www.transferology.com and log in, or create an account if you don't already have one.



3) In the "School Name" field, start typing the name of the school where you want to take the course, and select it from the drop-down list that appears. If the school isn't listed in Transferology, use the CEAS Transfer Credit Review Form.




4) In the "Department" field, start typing the department code of the course you want to take, and select it from the drop-down list that appears. If the department isn't listed in Transferology, use the CEAS Transfer Credit Review Form.




5) A list of courses will appear for the school/department you have selected. Click the + symbol next to the course you want to take. If the course isn't listed, use the CEAS Transfer Credit Review Form.

6) If you want to search for multiple courses, repeat this process. The course(s) you've selected will show in the "My Courses" section on the right-hand side of the screen. When you're done adding courses, click "Search for Matches."



7) Start typing "University of Colorado Boulder" into the search field at the top of the page, then click on the "% Match" box next to CU Boulder.



- 8) The results for your class will appear. There are three possible results for each course:
 - Match the course has been evaluated and given an equivalent CU Boulder course number. Do not use
 the CEAS Transfer Credit Review Form contact your advisor if you need more information. See #9
 below.
 - Miss the course is non-transferrable. Do not use the CEAS Transfer Credit Review Form.
 - Maybe the course has not yet been reviewed. Use the CEAS Transfer Credit Review Form.

9) For courses listed as "Match," the CU Boulder course equivalent will be listed. If the CU Boulder equivalent is accepted toward your degree, the course is approved for transfer.

If you don't know whether the CU Boulder equivalent is accepted toward your degree, you can contact your advisor for more information. Some courses may be accepted by CU Boulder generally, but will not count toward your degree. Other courses may be accepted at your department's discretion. You should always talk to your advisor before taking a course if you're unsure if it will be accepted toward your degree.

Here's an example of a course that is listed as a match, but should not be taken before talking to your advisor:

Important! Even if the course is approved to transfer and to count toward your degree, you should be aware of the following:

- You must get a C- or higher for CU Boulder to accept the course for transfer. Your department may require a C or higher for the course to count toward your degree.
- You are responsible for making up any difference in semester credit hours between the CU Boulder course and the transfer course. Be especially cautious when taking a class on a quarter system, as these will be converted to semester hours when the class is transferred.
- You must petition to waive the In-Residence Credit Requirement if you will be within 45 credits of graduation when you take the transfer course.
