
## CU English Language Screening Test- Speaking

Proctor	This is a speaking test. There are time limits following each question. I will let you know when to start and stop talking. Do your best to answer as well as you can within the stated time limit. The total test time will be about 10 minutes. These questions are not intended to measure your knowledge of any particular field, but to provide a context so that your ability to communicate can be evaluated.
