PERSONAL COMMENTS

I am in Italy at my first international music festival. Most of my fellow musicians are Italian, my roommate is French, and English is not something we share among us. Performing for Frasier Meadows over the course of 3 years allowed me to develop a lasting relationship with one couple in particular, who often invited me into their home for discussions after my concerts. As they shared a lifetime of stories with me, I could not help but admire their resiliency in thriving in a place where death was an everyday occurrence, and was delighted that my music was able to provide some measure of comfort. I treasured this understanding of their experiences beyond the context of their present infirmities.

Working as a medical scribe has allowed me to actualize my idealism in connecting with patients. One gentleman's story has stayed with me, where no matter how his health deteriorated over the 6 months that I knew him, he always had a smile for me. He shared with me his journey of fleeing a homophobic home environment before contracting a debilitating lung disease. One day, after breaking down in front of me over his indifferent treatment by a provider in a different office, I learned an important lesson how not to interact with patients. My taking an interest in his journey made him feel human again, and helped him separate his identity from his disease. This experience has helped shape the kind of physician that I envision myself being, as one that is attuned to both my patients' emotional and physical needs.

My drive to become a physician stems from the opportunities that medicine would grant me to help people through difficult and vulnerable situations, allowing me to use my communication skills as an empath to address the whole person while using my analytical skills as a scientist to solve complex biological problems.
